

1. The top three (3) essays will be recognize during the Awarding Ceremonies. The winners will receive medals and certificates of recognition.

4. Each individual entry will be judge based on the following criterion:

**Content (Depth of Information) 25%**  
**Structure (Grammar & Use of Language) 25%**  
**Style (Creativity & Originality) 20%**  
**Critical Analysis (Opinion & Social Relevance) 30%**

### **ASTRO Rhythm: Dance of the Stars**

#### *Entertainment Night Competition*

1. The competition is open to all CSIW participating schools. Only one (1) eligible entry per school is allowed.
2. The concept for CSIW 2009's Entertainment Night Competition is a Dance Production. The main theme for the performance and costume/props should be related to astronomy (space science).
3. The school entry will be comprised of 5-15 members who are bonafide students of the school they represent as of SY 2009-2010.
4. The performance will run for 4-6 minutes (entrance and exit are included). A 30-second preparation time will be allotted before the presentation proper. Two (2) points will be deducted from the average score for every minute excess or a fraction thereof.
5. The audition (elimination round) will be on October 25, 2009 from 12:00nn-3:00pm. Each school will be given a timeslot wherein they are required to audition. The guidelines of Audition will be given during the registration process.
6. The school should pass the following before the start of the audition (elimination round).
  - Introduction of their dance (not part of the performance). This will be used to introduce the group to the audience.

- Documentations (pictures) of the group. The group may also submit a 1-min Audio-visual Presentation introducing the group.
7. Only the top seven schools will be allowed to compete. However, if there are only ten groups or less who joined the audition, all of them will be allowed to compete.
  8. Only three winners will be declared. Champion, 1<sup>st</sup> Runner-up and 2<sup>nd</sup> Runner-up.
  9. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.
  10. The CSIW 09 Programs Committee reserves the right to modify rules without prior notice if deemed necessary.

➤ <b>CHOREOGRAPHY</b>	<b>30%</b>
<i>This includes the composition and arrangement of dance steps and movements and its difficulty.</i>	
➤ <b>RELEVANCE TO THE THEME</b>	<b>25%</b>
<i>This includes the creativity of the group in incorporating a concept related to space.</i>	
➤ <b>VISUAL IMPACT</b>	<b>20%</b>
<i>This includes the costumes and props used.</i>	
➤ <b>SYNCHRONIZATION</b>	<b>25%</b>
<i>This involves the mastery and unity of the steps.</i>	
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>100%</b>

It is “a global effort initiated by the International Astronomical Union (IAU) and UNESCO to help the citizens of the world rediscover their place in the Universe through the day- and night-time sky, and thereby engage a personal sense of wonder and discovery.”

### CSIW AKLAN

CSIW returns to the Visayas Islands through the beautiful province of Aklan. Known for its Ati Atihan and Boracay Island, the province is one of the country’s top tourist destinations. The camp venue, the award winning **Sampaguita Gardens** ([www.sampaguitagardens.com](http://www.sampaguitagardens.com)), is itself a tourist attraction in the province.

#### How to get to Aklan:

**By Air:** There are two airports in the province. Kalibo Airport is just a **few minutes** from Sampaguita Gardens. It is served by daily flights by Philippine Airlines and Cebu Pacific from Manila. Another airport, Caticlan (Boracay) Airport is about **2 hours** from the venue.

**By Land:** Philtranco, a land transportation service here in the Philippines which leave daily by scheduled time. Routes are from Cubao, Manila for Mindanao which will automatically pass to Caticlan through the Strong Republic Nautical Highway (RORO).

**Through Iloilo City:** Iloilo City, the regional capital, has numerous flights by major airlines from principal cities in the country. Its seaport is also served by major shipping lines from different cities in the country. Iloilo City is about **three hours** of land transportation from the venue.
