Sudanese Visual History Program

The Sudanese Visual History Program is an archive project that seeks to document the vivid, detailed events told through the oral storytelling tied so closely to the Sudanese culture. To date, the project has collected over 40 hours of interviews documenting the life stories and experiences of a diverse group of Sudanese whose lives have been marred by decades of war in Southern Sudan. Their goal is to preserve the Sudanese cultural history and serve as an archive and resource for all Sudanese, scholars, human rights organizations and the world community. The interviews cover experiences before the war, during the war, and today. Lost Boys and Girls are invited to contribute their stories to the archive.

Betty Wilson is the Board Chair of the American Sudanese Charitable Alliance in Denver, CO. She is the Adjunct Professor of Geology in the Department of Earth Sciences and the Policy Fellow at the Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center at the University of Maine in Orono, ME.

Tom Wilson is the Chairman of Nautilus Resources in Denver, CO. He is an Officer and Advisor at YEP Luxembourg.

Both Betty and Tom have a long track record of successful oil and gas ventures domestically and internationally. Betty now focuses on teaching and philanthropy, while Tom continues to work in the upstream and midstream oil and gas industry. Together they founded the Sudanese Visual History Program, whose purpose is to record and document the life stories and experiences of a diverse group of Sudanese whose lives have been marred by decades of war in South Sudan.
