This winery is renowned as one of Adelaide Hill's finest with A grade vineyards. It is rated as 5 red star winery in James Halliday's Australian Wine Companion. Its winemaker was formerly the chief winemaker for no other than Shaw + Smith.

This is the Estate non-vintage sparkling rated 95/100 by James Halliday who said, "fresh, lively, the balance excellent, ditto the length".

Its already unbelievable value at cellar door for its modest \$22 a bottle price tag, making its value under Hidden Label Adelaide Hills Pinot Noir Chardonnay Brut NV (KHL 7739) at only \$13 a bottle stupendous. This is a sparkling that everyone should always have in their fridge.

John Glaetzer

John Glaetzer is a living legend of the South Australian wine industry.

John was the senior red winemaker at Wolf Blass Wines. What Wolf Blass Wines achieved, with John leading the winemaker, was simply unheralded in the Australian wine industry. John's winemaking for Wolf Blass resulted in an unrivalled four of the prestigious Jimmy Watson trophies for Australia's top red wine in 1974, 1975, 1976, and 1999. They also combined to win eleven Montgomery Trophies for the best red wines at the Royal Adelaide Wine Show. And that's just the tip of the iceberg.

It would be fair to say that amongst Australia's fine wine making fraternity, there are few others who share, with John Glaetzer, the extent and depth of contribution to super premium red wine.

John had a vision to create his own unique premium wine label, and John's Blend was the result. John's Blend was developed side-by-side with his prominent role at Wolf Blass Wines. The first vintage under his own label was in 1974, and John's Blend was an instant success when released in 1977. It is renowned as full bodied and one for the cellar (for a decade or two for starters). 2018 was one of South Australia's best vintages and this John's Blend is a classic release.

It is a strictly limited - a cult wine that sells out nationally, in a flash.



THE POTTS FAMILY
BLEASDALE
 EST 1850

In the 1850s, Frank Potts planted the Bleasdale's first vines in Langhorne Creek making Bleasdale Australia's second oldest family-owned wine company. The winery was constructed in 1892 and in keeping with Bleasdale's historical significance, is classified by National Trust, along with its ancient basket press and various other pieces of antique equipment. With an emphasis on full-bodied reds straight varietals and blends made from shiraz, cabernet and malbec, Bleasdale has earned the top 5-star winery rating in James Halliday's Australian Wine Companion, and the winery boasts frequent trips to the podium at major wine shows to collect a constant flow of trophies and gold medals.

Chief winemaker Paul Hotker took the reins in 2008 and hasn't looked back, with Bleasdale's wines going from strength to strength since his arrival. With experience in both winemaking and viticulture at a number of Australian and New Zealand wineries, Paul's skill-set is very formidable. The combination of Langhorne Creek's old vines with Paul's traditional and contemporary winemaking techniques, promise an extremely prosperous future for this historic winery.

Bleasdale is clearly Australia's flagship malbec producer. Bleasdale has been growing Malbec since the late 1800's and produced the region's first Malbec table wine from the 1961 vintage. The 2019 Generations Malbec has just picked up a top gold medal and the trophy for best other varietal red at the Royal Adelaide Wine Show. To prove it was no fluke it also won the trophy for Best Other Red Variety at the 2021 Winewise Championship. Intense yet generous, it offers violets, blackberries, cream, satsuma plums, porcini and spice on the nose. The palate is black and deeply flavoured; the fruit, acid and tannin perfectly balanced. It is excellent already and will cellar for many decades.

This wine spent 18 months in a mix of French and American hogsheads. The wine is a bright maroon colour and then the aromas come to the fore. Plush, ripe, rich, a cracking regional Shiraz. Chocolate, black fruits, mulberries, leather and cocoa powder. The texture is an absolute highlight. It is gorgeously velvety through to the softest of tannins. A mosaic of crus, grape varieties, vintages, aromas and flavours - this flagship cuvee could not be named more aptly (hint). A blend where Chardonnay is the dominant grape variety (35%-40%), giving freshness and delicate aromas. Pinot Noir (35%-40%) adds structure and Pinot Meunier (25%-30%) brings fruit. The grapes are sourced from exceptional terroirs, including the Grands Crus of the Cote des Blancs and the Montagne de Reims. The presence of 20% reserve wine ensures a consistent style, while more than three years ageing and a light dosage of 10g/l result in a balanced and complex champagne. Wine critic Huon Hooke agrees saying that "the palate is rich and soft... and a very dry savouriness that lingers. Lip-smacking crisp dryness".

The best champagnes to match with oysters are dry. This has just 3 grams/litre "liqueur d'expedition" - it is dry but avoids austerity. It also benefits from 20% older reserve wines as well as long ageing on lees which brings length, power and richness of red fruit. Very good value when compared to the big name champagne brands at a similar price.

Here we have something very special. It is the same producer as KSL 5556 but their more premium (and pricey) Extra Brut. Extra Brut ages for five years rather than the usual three of the normal NV champagne. It has a higher portion of Chardonnay but must notably uses less than 4g/l of sugar resulting in a fine balance of freshness, maturity and dryness (that we very much enjoy). Perfect match with oysters. Stocks are tiny so don't miss this.

The real excitement in Champagne is from the small artisan producers especially in Cotes des Blanc. Charles and Emmanuel Fourny from Vertus are at the forefront of that excitement. Grande Reserve is a blend of 80% chardonnay and 20% pinot noir/pinot meunier (40% reserve wine from previous vintages). It is a champagne of precision and purity. Wine critic Huon Hooke says "the style is chardonnay driven but very complex, with some aldehydes in a nutty, apple bouquet of great depth and complexity. It's nervy, taut and refined in the mouth with lip smacking tang". In the landscape of champagne this is true artisan champagne at a great price.

Moët & Chandon Brut Imperial NV

Region: Champagne Rating: 94/100

Established in 1743, Moët & Chandon was the first champagne house and to this day the world's best selling champagne. Moët Imperial is the House's iconic champagne. Created in 1869, it embodies the unique Moët & Chandon style of being vibrant, generous and alluring. The nose is delicately vinous, with an initial aroma of both lime and vine blossom. The palate shows predominantly Pinot characteristics. Light, persistent sparkle. Very ample in the mouth, with a discreet finish. Champagne guru Tyson Stelzer is suitably impressed with recent bottlings, noting that "this is the freshest and most fruit-focused I have seen it." He sums it up by declaring that this is "better-made than ever". The tradition continues.

Champagne Lallier R.016 NV

Chef de cave since 2000, fourth-generation Champagne winemaker Francis Tribaut purchased Lallier when Rene-James Lallier retired in 2004. At the time, production totalled only 50,000 bottles. In just one decade, it mushroomed to a cool 400,000 bottles, where it is capped today. Typically a blend of Pinot Noir (60%) and Chardonnay (40%). The majority of champagne is from the vintage on the front label, with approximately 20% reserve wine from prior vintages. An intense nose of crisp apple leads into a ripe, rounded, apple and lemon fruited palate. It is dry and well balanced. This is Champagne that is vintage dominant, in that context, the value is off the charts compared with the big name non-vintage champagnes and any vintage Champagne.

It's beautifully structured with classic lively citrus flavours and complex nuttiness, with great texture having had up to four years on lees. A high percentage of reserve wines ensures a great champagne experience.

La Cuvée turns up the house's chardonnay dominant style. A new star has been born.

Clover Hill is one of Australia's top sparkling wine producers. In 1986, on the site of an old dairy farm in north-east Tasmania, the magnificent Clover Hill Vineyard was established by the Goelet family. Their aim was, and still is, to produce superb sparkling wine using traditional French methodology. Since its debut vintage in 1991, Clover Hill has gained a reputation for its uncompromising quality, its elegance and finesse, and its distinguished Tasmanian style.

NON-VINTAGE

Sparkling

There's a common misconception amongst wine enthusiasts that non-vintage (NV) sparkling is inferior to their vintage counterparts. In fact, because NV wines are often far better drinking when young because they are usually blends of recent vintages with older 'reserve wines' which add that extra softness and complexity which comes with age. Vintage sparkling generally need some bottle age before they hit their 'sweet spot', so NV wines have a very important role to play in the scheme of sparkling things. Having said that, you'll often find that the best NV wines can develop even more character with time in the cellar.

Clover Hill Methode Traditionnelle Tasmanian Cuvee NV

Region: Tasmania Rating: 95/100 🍷🍷

The Clover Hill Tasmanian Cuvee comprises select parcels of chardonnay, pinot noir and pinot meunier grapes from the Clover Hill vineyard in Tasmania's Piper River. It is aged on lees for at least two years ensuring the vivacity and intensity that is the hallmark of Clover Hill's vintage sparklings. It is a very rich and complex wine with brioche and toast wrapped around the fruit, extending the finish considerably.

The 2015 Yarrabank Cuvee is a blend of 50% Pinot Noir, 50% Chardonnay all sourced from Wombat Creek, one of the higher elevations in the Yarra Valley and that extra layer of finesse and freshness is always a bonus in sparkling wine. Released under the careful eye of new Senior Winemaker Brendan Hawker, returned to Yering after other wine adventures.

Sumptuous flavours of dark chocolate, quince, red apples and kumquats are all wrapped up in a nutty blanket of smooth, fine bubbles, finishing smoky and rich. On the palate, the flavours offer a soft fruitiness of peaches that have been poached in vanilla, star anise, cinnamon and nutmeg but at no point do these rich and complex flavours become overwhelming of the freshness and acidity that bring backbone and structure to the wine.

If I'm honest, I feel a little underdressed even drinking this, it deserves better. I should be at the sort of dinner party that has crushed velvet drapes, Titian paintings, serving rolled pork loin stuffed with prunes soaked in Armagnac and a dessert that involves dark chocolate mousse and gold leaf. The great vintages feature fruit from cooler climates and picked at high levels of natural acidity. As such, they can be quite 'nervy' as youngsters, and benefit from bottle age to settle them down. Consequently, these wine can be outstanding cellaring options.



Rosé has secured a firm foothold in the Australian wine market with its freshness and versatility. Its popularity continues to skyrocket, and there's an explosion in the number of new brands appearing on the shelves.

Rosé wines can be made in most of the world's wine regions and they are made in quite different vineyard locations with vastly varying temperature regimes, even in Europe. However, the best rosés from Europe are from Provence where it is

warmer and drier. The extra fruit flavours and tannin ripeness even at lower alcohols achieved in these sunny, warm and dry conditions does the trick... achieving the right balance between alcohol, fruit flavour, ripeness and tannin ripeness.

Grape variety is important and we see the best Australian rosé being made from Rhone varieties and other native European varieties such as nebbiolo.
