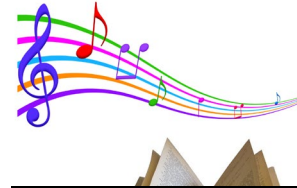
Think about this...

So what is copyright?

Copyright is a type of protection given to anyone who creates something. This includes writing, art and music.



Why is plagiarism wrong?

How do you

- It is disrespectful to the person who created the work.
- Plagiarism is stealing.
- Plagiarism is cheating.
- Plagiarism is illegal.

So what do I do?

- Give credit to the person who created the work.
- Summarize the words (put them in your own words.)
- Use your own sources (don't copy the information.)
- Give credit for any information you use.

Citation

- information about your source
- must be written a certain way

Note: different sources means different information

- a list all of the sources that you used to find your information
- listed in alphabetical order by the author's last name
- includes books, magazines, web sites, images and online databases and encyclopedias


