NOTICE

Grassyfork Fisheries Co., Inc. intends to lower the level of Lake DeTurk this August for the purpose of doing some improvement around the shore lines. It is anticipated that water will start being dropped August 1, 1974. It will be lowered approximately 4 feet from its present elevation. This will be an excellent time for people owning frontage lots to do any improvement work they have in mind on their own lots.

It is anticipated that two months will be sufficient for carrying out the intended work which is primarily to clear out around the inlet area. However, this depends much on the weather and excessive rains at the time would obviously delay matters.

Normal winter precipitation will refill the lake.

We are curious about fishing techniques used on Lake DeTurk. The valley it is in was formerly one of the most productive portions of the hatchery, it was stocked with minnows for feeding game fish and then game fish themselves. We know there are at least 15 bass in Lake DeTurk that run over 10 pounds each. Are they out foxing you? What about the 34 pound cat fish?
