

Council okays suspension of Camp 7 barangay captain

BAGUIO CITY - The City Council approved the recommendation of the Committee on Barangay Cases Division 3 ordering the suspension of Camp 7 Punong Barangay Constancio Danao after finding him guilty of issuing an untruthful certification that nobody in his barangay interposed an opposition on the intended transfer station for recyclable waste in the said barangay.

Danao's suspension will take effect 15 days after the City Mayor shall have signed the resolution relative to the said decision of the local legislative body which was penned by Councilor Faustino A. Olowan.

The case stemmed from the certification issued by Danao claiming that no resident has objected to the planned use of GA Flores Construction of a parcel of land in their barangay as a transfer station for recyclable waste amidst the strong opposition from concerned residents due to the dangers that the transfer station will pose to their health and **Cont. on page 2**

Mayor wants lease problem at convention center fixed

BAGUIO CITY - Mayor Mauricio Domogan last week directed city administrator Carlos Canilao to immediately fix the problem on the lease contracts of the tenants at the Baguio Convention Center.

In a memorandum last March 14, the mayor reminded Canilao of an earlier directive to ensure that all the operations of the occupants in the facility are covered by the necessary contracts to avoid questions and complications.

"You were then directed to see to it that all the said occupants are covered

by contracts of lease submitted to the City Council for confirmation," the mayor said.

"This memorandum is therefore being sent to you to ensure that you complied with all the said requirements."

Canilao in turn ordered the city tourism operations division to submit a report on the status of the contracts and the actions done in compliance to the mayor's earlier directive.

He assured that the contracts will be in order by next week in compliance with the mayor's order.

Issues on the contracts of the tenants of the said

facility had hounded the city government particularly the failure to renew the expired memorandum of agreement and the lack of confirmation by the city council.

This has even reached the attention of the Commission on Audit last year which prompted the city council to review the contracts.

Canilao said there are less than ten concessionaires in the facility including the Smart Telco, the Securities and Exchange Commission and van operators and drivers associations which use the area for parking. / *Aileen P. Refuerzo#*

environment.

Former Councilor Federico J. Mandapat, Jr. then filed a case of dishonesty, irregularity, and neglect in the performance of duties, misconduct and grave abuse of discretion against Danao for the issuance of the questionable certification.

Concerned residents of Camp 7 formed an organization called the Camp 7 Coalition for Good Governance and elected Mandapat as their president and initially filed an administrative case against Danao before the local legislative body for his having issued an untruthful certification that nobody interposed an opposition to the intended transfer station for recyclable waste at Camp 7.

Two more complaints on malversation of public funds through falsification of public documents were filed by Mark John Pepin,

et. al. against Danao and were forwarded to the office of the Ombudsman for Luzon for its proper action and disposition by the city prosecutor's office.

The residents also questioned the operation of a batching plant of Engr. William Tan before the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) in the Cordillera and that they were furnished by the said office with a copy of Barangay Council Resolution No. 25-2012 which granted clearance for the said questionable batching plant.

The residents claimed the barangay clearance is highly irregular because of the existence of Ordinance No. 43, series of 2007 prohibiting the operation of batching plants around the city.

The complaint stated to date Danao has not issued a certified copy of the said questionable resolution neither did

he make a formal reply to their queries which is in violation of the provisions of Republic Act (RA) 6713 which provides that all public officials and employees must act within 15 days from receipt of any request and must make a reply that contains the actions taken thereon.

On the other hand, Danao denied the allegations in Mandapat's complaint, claiming that it was baseless and without factual basis made purposely to embarrass and malign his person and the truth is that the complainant does not know the truth and falsity of the matters stated in the complaint. The committee found that Danao has failed to consider the rules of procedures for environmental cases promulgated by no less than the Supreme Court (SC). Further, the committee believes Danao's position lacks credence, especially that it is not supported by any evidence./By Dexter A. See#

City lauds honest, dedicated public servants

BAGUIO CITY - The local legislature unanimously approved two separate measures commending individuals for honesty and public service.

In resolution number 89, series of 2017, Raul Frigillana, a security guard at Teacher's Camp, is commended for "his exemplary act of honesty" in returning a wallet containing a huge amount of money

including several identification and bank cards, to the owner on February 5, this year.

Upon finding the wallet, he immediately contacted its owner, Sheila Marie Vallador, to inform her of the wallet and how he can return it.

"The act of Raul Frigillana strengthens the fact that residents of Baguio are indeed honest and trust-

worthy and deserve praise and commendation from the city and its officialdom," the measure states.

On the other hand, resolution number 93, series of 2017, commends police officer 2 Ben Pais, a traffic beat cop, for his "outstanding public service and dedication".

TTMC summit

BAGUIO CITY – Stakeholders, public utility vehicle drivers and operators, students and school administrators, private individuals, government officials, senior citizens and persons with disability, the Baguio City Police Office and interested entities came together and voiced out traffic concerns during the summit at the Baguio Convention Center last Thursday.

The summit which aimed to address the city's heavy traffic problems through odd-even

schemes, an improved public transport through the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) –proposed monorail passing through the Balili river was well-participated in by the stakeholders.

Other suggestions include road-widening, the construction of serviceable overpasses near congested areas and the school-belt, more consultations and information campaigns in the barangays and strict implementation of traffic rules and regulations.

In the ensuing analysis, however, self-discipline ranked foremost as the determining factor in traffic problem solving.

The administrative order for the anti-road obstruction drive was also discussed, with Councilor

Michael Lawana explaining the salient points, as to the deputization of barangay officials.

Traffic expert Engr. Teodorico Tan explained the mechanics for road status, transport, sidewalk and pedestrians, and needed facilities. The business sector and academics group also gave feedback, as with the jeepney trunkline association officers.

Bypass roads along and through the neighboring towns of La Trinidad, Itogon, Sablan and Tuba were also acknowledged as traffic relievers, with officials of public works and highways present.

During the participatory forum, the stakeholders ranked the short, medium

Burnham Park report

BAGUIO CITY – Administrative Order 21, series of 2015; “Rules and Regulations governing operation and maintenance of the “Burnham Park Reservation,” is being strictly implemented, it was reported during the Alay Sa Kalinisan (ASK) meeting last week.

Project Evaluation Officer Joseph Hermogeno informed the group that in February and the past months, there were individuals caught violating provisions of AO 21; as to anti-smoking, peddling and intake of intoxicating liquor in the park, and public scandal involving minors. Violators were made to pay fines and some rendered community service, while offender minors were sent to counseling along with their parents.

There were also masseurs and those performing tattoo art in the park who were apprehended, documented and given warnings. Charges are filed in court against violators if the warnings remain unheeded, Hermogeno said.

Provisions in Section 2 of AO 21, prohibit smoking, drinking, undue burning, destroying of plants, unnecessary noise-making, littering and spitting, in the park, including personal services such as massage, nail spa (manicure and pedicure), and tattoo, thus personnel of the City Environment and Parks Management Office (CEPMO) and the security guard agency for the park ensure the enforcement and implementation of said legislative measure.

Clean-ups are also conducted in coordination with private groups, as with replanting of ornamental plants at the rose garden by students; flushing at the Igorot Park, Harrison road to Athletic Bowl; rose Garden, childrens’ park and Melvin Jones grandstand. Mowing, trimming, cleaning and maintenance are regular activities but done more frequently during special occasions, Hermogeno added.

Improvements also include repainting of the Sunshine Park stage, bandstand rooftop and fence of the Baguio City High School (BCHS); and landscaping of the Ganza parking entrance.

Rehabilitation within the Burnham lake this year, with project cost of around P19M is planned in coordination with the Department of Tourism-CAR, it was known. /Julie G. Fianza#

Has 'overwork' taken on epidemic proportions in the country?

What's the real score with overworked Filipinos? We're taking a closer look. Last week Senator Grace Poe cited data from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) showing that, as of 2015, around 8.1 million Filipinos were considered overworked (or worked for more than 48 hours in a week). This number represents a 41% increase since 1995.

According to Senator Poe, this finding is crucial since "several studies have shown that excessive work hours could trigger serious health problems and even cause death." Indeed, overwork can lead to higher risks of impaired sleep, depression, and heart disease (among other things). Overworked employees are also not necessarily more productive because of their longer hours.

The latest statistics prompted Senator Poe to initiate an investigation that will inform future legislation to ensure "just and humane work conditions" for Filipinos.

But in this article we take a closer look at the data. First, although more Filipinos are overworked, the problem is not as extensive as it seems, given that the number of employed Filipinos grew even faster. Second, the issue of underemployment – which comprises those who want to work more hours – is a similarly disturbing matter that needs just as much attention.

EDITORIAL

The extent of overwork

In February 2017 the PSA released a report entitled, "Decent Work in the Philippines," which features statistics on overworked Filipinos.




Figure 1. Source: PSA and author's calculations of Labor Force Survey data. Period covered: 1995 to 2015. Note: a person is considered "overworked" if he or she worked for more than 48 hours in a week.

But Figure 1 shows that, while the number of overworked Filipinos grew by 41% from 1995 to 2015, the number of employed Filipinos also grew by 51% over the same period. The net effect is that the share of overworked Filipinos to the employed has stayed roughly constant in the past 21 years (averaging 22%). The 2015 figure

THE SHARE OF OVERWORKED FILIPINOS IS THE LOWEST SINCE 1995

of 20.9% was actually the lowest since 1995.

In other words, the extent of overwork did not become terribly more serious over the past 2 decades. In fact, it has declined to a record low: a smaller proportion of employed Filipinos are now overworked compared to 1995.

The extent of underemployment

Perhaps just as troubling, however, is the extent of employed Filipinos who say they want to work more hours, or the "under-employed."

Following international standards, the PSA defines the underemployed as those who desire "to have additional hours of work in their present job or an additional job, or have a new job with longer working hours."




Figure 2. Source: PSA. Period covered: January 2005 to January 2017.

As of January 2017, 16.3% of employed Filipinos were underemployed. Figure 2 shows that this figure is not just stubbornly high, but also historically higher than the unemployment rate: the latest underemployment rate is nearly 2.5 times as large as the unemployment rate.

The prevalence of underemployment is troubling from the viewpoints of growth and equity.

UNDEREMPLOYMENT IS SIMILARLY A SERIOUS PROBLEM

From a growth viewpoint, it's not enough that more Filipinos have jobs. Instead, we want them to work in high-quality jobs where their skills and knowledge can be utilized most productively. Otherwise, not only will workers be unsatisfied with their work, but national productivity and growth will also suffer.

From an equity viewpoint,

FB Live: broadcasting worldwide

LIFE'S INSPIRATIONS: "... In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the word..." (2 Timothy 4:1-2, the Holy Bible).

THE MIRACLE OF BROADCASTING WORLDWIDE THRU FACEBOOK LIVE: Today's column concerns a personal matter. I wish to invite everyone to visit two Facebook pages or timelines, where I am the administrator---the "Ang Tanging Daan" and "Kakampi Mo ang Batas" timelines.

For the last several days---and I pray to God this can go on at least until the purposes for which those Facebook pages or timelines have been established shall have been achieved---I have been broadcasting daily through what is now known as "Facebook Live" broadcast application (or "apps", as these things are usually referred to by Internet users around the world).

Indeed, I can only say, "thank God in the Name of Jesus" for this wonderful instrumentality made available for free by Facebook, because through it, I can now bring my advocacy for spreading the Gospel that says Jesus is God and Savior, and is God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, technically to the whole world, and for helping our countrymen, wherever they maybe, understand the complications and solutions to their legal problems.

"ANG TANGING DAAN", BIBLE STUDY IN ENGLISH: The broadcast for "Ang Tanging Daan" is now carried out on a daily basis, usually starting between 7 p.m. up to 9 p.m. The starting time for the broadcast varies everyday, depending on whether or not I have already done away with the various tasks that are confronting me daily---as a broadcaster, columnist, trial lawyer, legal and management consultant, preacher, and, sometimes, as counselor.

Then, as the experience of the past one week has shown, I usually go on air for about 45 minutes to one hour. The topics that I have been discussing focus on the teachings and basic doctrines of the Christian church where God graciously installed me as its first Leader Disciple since 2007, the Anak ng Diyos Kadugo Ni Kristo (or the Children of God Blood Kin of the Christ) Church.

What is more, the live broadcast is simultaneously recorded by Facebook itself, so that anyone wishing to view or listen to any previous broadcast all over again can simply go back to the page "Ang Tanging Daan" by writing and clicking "Ang Tanging Daan" at the search engine of Facebook. Once the "Ang Tanging Daan" page appears, the image of the desired broadcast should be clicked to savor the discussions once more.

"KAKAMPI MO ANG BATAS" GOES ON AIR ONCE AGAIN: The broadcast for "Kakampi Mo Ang Batas" employs the same process, and is also aimed to be held on a daily basis likewise, usually right after the Facebook Live broadcast for "Ang Tanging Daan" is completed. And just like the "Ang Tanging Daan" broadcast, it also lasts between 45 minutes to one hour.

"Kakampi Mo Ang Batas" features the English and Filipino columns I write everyday for newspapers in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao, and in the Metro

Editorial from page 4 some studies show that most of the unemployed are actually nonpoor (e.g., college graduates waiting for good job prospects), while most of the underemployed are poor. Hence, some economists contend that solving underemployment might help a lot to abate poverty.

Who are the overworked and underemployed? The issues of overwork (working excessive hours) and underemployment (wanting to work more hours) are distinct problems. But they both highlight the crucial importance of ensuring job quality in our labor markets. What can we do about them? First, we can start by identifying the occupations that are most affected by overwork and underemployment. By doing so, we can introduce regulations and policies in these occupations to improve their working conditions. Table 1 shows the top occupations where we can find the overworked and underemployed. On the left, one can see that most of the overworked are: general managers and proprietors; blue collar workers (such as domestic helpers, laundrers, and messengers); and models, salespersons, and demonstrators. Meanwhile, on the right, as many as 34% or over a third of underemployed workers can be found in agriculture- and fisheries-related trades.

Second, more research needs to dwell on the reasons behind overwork and underemployment. For instance, overwork may sometimes be a consequence of the nature of certain jobs, so policies might do little in reducing work hours. Also, underemployment may be expected in jobs characterized by seasonality (as in agriculture). In any case, the effectiveness of interventions need to be informed by more studies about the determinants of overwork and underemployment. Third, some experts believe that overwork and especially underemployment are symptomatic of a high "education-skills mismatch." For instance, overwork may be the result of professionals being forced to do tasks beyond their expertise, so they work longer hours than usual. Also, underemployment may be the result of highly-educated workers finding work in menial jobs. By reducing the gap between our graduates' skills and the firms' demands, we could reduce long work hours and the underutilization of our people's skills.

Job quality matters In sum, we need not worry too much about the increase in the number of overworked Filipinos cited by Senator Poe. Some labor-related statistics are just better reported in terms of percentages or shares, to account for changes in the labor force and the number of employed Filipinos over time. Perhaps a better target for research and policy is how we can generate higher-quality jobs (and not simply more jobs) to address the distinct but equally important problems of overwork and underemployment. A better understanding of excessive and inadequate work hours will bring not just more workplace satisfaction, but also higher growth and greater equity for the country./ Rappler.com (The author is a PhD student and teaching fellow at the UP School of Economics. I also have to teach myself in simplifying things which I thought was simple to the city children's eye.

As a teacher, I am so blessed to experience the best of both worlds. It had made me practice what I always preach on my article and vlog like flexibility, adaptability, and the ability to learn fast. Aside from that it made me give more respect to our fellow teachers at the countryside. They are well-equipped and well prepared with less material. They can create a something from nothing. 
City lauds honest... February 11, this year, Pais immediately left his post

Duties of Baguio City Anti-Dengue Committee defined

BAGUIO CITY - With the recent city ordinance no. 66 also known as the Anti-Dengue Ordinance of the city of Baguio which aims to continually reduce the occurrence of dengue cases in the city through integrated management and implementation of prevention and control measures, strengthening the fight against it, mayor Mauricio Domogan enumerated the functions of the newly created Baguio City Anti-Dengue Committee (BCADC).

Domogan will chair the said committee with city health officer Rowena Galpo as the action officer. The members include sangguniang panlungsod committee on health and sanitation, ecology and environmental protection chair councilor Elaine Sembrano will sponsor/author or perform the necessary legislative action as recommended by the BCADC.

Association of Barangay Council (ABC) president councilor Michael Lawana will facilitate the conduct of massive public awareness campaigns at the 128 barangays which includes, but not limited to, the organization for health education lectures, manner of destroying breeding sites, participation in the "Oplan-Alis Kiti Kiti, Goodbye Dengue" activities as well as disseminate all information relative to the implementation of the ordinance at the barangays.

City building official will ensure that owners, managers, administrators, officers-in-charge of buildings that will undergo construction or even repair are informed of the ordinance, ensure that buildings under construction or repair must not

accumulate stagnant water and solid wastes, and to inform them to maintain dry and clean surroundings at construction sites and provide proper drainage to prevent water stagnation. To maintain dry and clean surroundings in canals, streets, and road repair sites and to provide proper drainage at road repair sites to prevent water stagnation will be responsibility of the city engineer.

The city environment and parks management officer will coordinate with the health services office in the conduct of public awareness campaigns such as health education lectures, manner of destroying breeding sites, among others as well as in the information dissemination relative to the implementation of the ordinance. To ensure that garbage collection receptacles or containers within the city are covered so that rain water would not accumulate and become breeding grounds of mosquitoes will be the look out of the city general services officer.

The city legal officer will assist in the orientation of the deputized Barangay Anti-Dengue Brigade (BADB) and will also extend legal assistance to the BCADC and BADB, if necessary. While the city social welfare and development officer will disseminate information about the ordinance and the anti-dengue plans and programs of the city to the day care workers in the barangays and at the same time responsible for referrals to the hospitals if dengue cases are suspected.

Responsible for the issuance of citation tickets to all violators will be the Baguio City Police Office director and the public information office will circulate information

ment of the Interior and Local Government Baguio field office will direct the barangays to eliminate possible mosquito breeding sites on a year-round basis and to monitor the health situation in their jurisdiction. They will mobilize community volunteers and barangay brigades for house-to-house cleanliness campaign and supervising and to ensure compliance of the duties and functions by all government offices concern, among others.

Among the duties of the Department of Health-CAR are to extend technical assistance through the conduct of training to all members of the BCADC; continue active surveillance, monitoring and follow-up of dengue fever patients; ensure that all hospitals in the city are prepared to handle dengue fever case as well as to ensure the availability and adequate supply of medications at all times; to implement effective control measures and to simulate the development, improvement and implementation of new strategies and interventions to improve understanding of dengue progression.

DOH-CAR will also design projects to help identify ways to better describe the impact of dengue infections, reduce intra-household spread dengue infections, and medical complications and case of fatality rates. They are in charge of encouraging collaborative activities with the different national agencies, among others.

It will be the responsibility of the Department of Education-CAR to refer to the school clinic, barangay officials, district health center medical officers, hospitals of HSO if any student, facility or staff shows any symptoms of dengue. They will strengthen dengue education program through school health teaching; conduct search, prevent and destroy possible breeding places of mosquitoes in school premises; to integrate proper education in the relevant subjects in the elementary and high school levels as well as implement

City prepares for CROWN evaluation

BAGUIO CITY - A city, health office and education-based technical working group (TWG) is convened through an administrative order issued

by Mayor Mauricio Domogan last week, in preparation for the Consistent Regional Outstanding Winner in Nutrition (CROWN) evaluation.

other preventive actions that the DOH may provide.

The Public Information Agency will conduct information education communication to constituents of Baguio and at the same time facilitate the dissemination of the ordinance.

Moreover, representatives from the academe and accredited non-governmental organizations will be determined by the BCADC.

The BCADC will be seeking the assistance of the academe in the different activities like community or barangay mobilization, health education on dengue, mass anti-dengue campaign, promotion of the anti-dengue campaigns in the city, surveillance of dengue cases and other activities geared towards the prevention and complete eradication of dengue.

Also, the mayor will deputize the BADB composed of the punong barangay, barangay officials in charge of the barangay's committee on health or environment, district health center medical officers covering the different barangays, barangay health workers and day care workers. It will be the duty of the

BADB to undertake and develop an effective dengue control plans and strategies; conduct search and destroy activities by mobilizing 100% of households in the community at the same time conduct community education; submit monthly report; implement the rules of ordinance no. 66; oversee the implementation of the synchronized community action and sustain the activities in the barangay; organize barangay clean up brigades, among others.

In the order, "it shall be unlawful to have, keep, maintain, cause or permit any collection of standing water or flowing waste

water in which aedes mosquitoes may be propagated. The owner will be responsible for the elimination of dengue virus carrying mosquitoes and any uncooperative owner, public or private entity can be summoned to appear at the office of the punong barangay".

DOH has reported that there were 70,697 dengue cases in the Philippines as of morbidity week 29 last year and most of the dengue cases were from regions IV-A, VII, XII and CAR ranks 9th among the 17 regions with the highest number of dengue cases. /Jho Arranz#
