Useful skills such as how to set up a home network and web server will be given. You could learn how to make your own router, or how to hack into various set top boxes. At the end of the Linux Boot Camp you will be able to tap into the world of open source computing and maybe set yourself off on a profitable and worthwhile career.

If you already know how to do some of this stuff, then don't despair, the structure of the Linux Boot Camp will allow you to explore advanced topics in system configuration.

The numbers are limited to about 60 places, so don't delay. There are a small number of residential places (12), staying in UWE's brand new student accommodation, (cost of approx £25 per night). During the Linux Boot Camp there will be social events in the evenings, such as films and barbecues.

As if that wasn't enough the Linux Boot Camp will give you the chance to experience what life could be like at Uni and will look great on your CV or UCAS form!
