What does a Perfect Father look like?

Psalm 18:30-32

[30] As for God, his way is perfect; the word of the LORD is flawless. He is a shield for all who take refuge in him. [31] For who is God besides the LORD? And who is the Rock except our God? [32] It is God who arms me with strength and makes my way perfect.

In this scripture God tells us...

1. He **Protects**... "He is a shield for all who take refuge in Him."
 2. He **Provides**... "It is God who arms me with strength"
 3. He **Perfects**... "...And makes my way perfect"

How our Perfect Father Perfects...
