
# JAR OF HEARTS

## PREP AND TEACH!

- Print off the 5-heart page onto white or coloured paper. Fold on the dotted lines and then cut out the hearts – that should give you 15 hearts per page.


Use this activity for individuals, pairs or groups.

- Pop the word on the jar, or into a real jar




