
Egg Cozy Sewing Pattern



Egg Cozy

Use the full stencil for the outer fabric. Fold the stencil at the dotted line and use this smaller stencil for the lining fabric. You'll need two cuts of each!

Printing instructions

Print in 100% scale on an A4-paper.

Top Loop

Cut out fabric and fold in the edges towards the middle, then fold in half. Press all folds

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Instructions

Cut out the stencil for both the Egg Cozy and the Top Loop. Use the full Egg Cozy stencil to cut out two pieces of fabric from your Cathy Nordström Fabric Swatch. Then take the stencil and fold at the line and use this shorter version to cut out the two pieces of lining fabric. Go ahead and cut out the top loop from the lining fabric as well.

We now have all 5 pieces of fabric needed for the project! To prepare the loop for sewing, you'll need to fold the fabric in half and press the fold with your iron. Open it up again and fold in the edges towards the middle, give both new folds a pressing and fold the whole thing in half again and give it a good pressing. We're now ready to sit down at the sewing machine. Sew the loop along the edge. Take one piece of the lining fabric and place it on top of one of the swatch fabrics and sew these together at the bottom line. Do the same thing with the other set. It's time to bring your project back to the ironing board. Fold out the lining fabric from the swatch fabric, carefully open the seam allowance and give it a good press. Place the two sets together, right sides facing each other, lining fabric touching lining fabric and swatch fabric touching swatch fabric.

Fold the loop in half and stick it in between the two swatch pieces. Make sure it's placed in the middle of the cozy with the looped part inside of the fabric sandwich, the two edges sticking out outside. Pin the whole thing together to secure it and sew along the outer edges, being careful to leave a hole at the bottom part where the lining is. Once this is done, go ahead and cut a few smaller cuts along the rounded parts of the cozy, both on the top and bottom. This is to make sure we'll get a cleaner edge on the finished project! Go ahead and turn the whole thing inside out (or rather the right way out) Some fidgeting is always required to get the seams in place. You can use a pencil or a pair of scissors to carefully poke the seams to get them to be in their right place. Press the seams once you are happy with how they sit.

Last thing to do is to sew the last edge of the bottom lining and once this is done you can fold in the lining and give your cozy one last pressing.

Voila! You've made your own Egg Cozy!

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
