What is included in the library substitute binder

Editable substitute pages and forms

• These pages are the ones you will leave for a substitute. They include schedules, procedures for the operation of the library, passwords etc. These pages are in PowerPoint. The fonts that I used are embedded into the document. You do not need to download the fonts to your computer. To edit, just click in the text box and type. You can add, delete or change any of the text. I included a few different options for some of the pages to give you more flexibility. At the end of the document, I added a few blank pages with the same border as the other pages.

Cover pages

Use these to divide your binder into sections. The editable PowerPoint can be
edited so you can put whatever text on the page that you want. I included a
PDF version that can not be edited.

Worksheets and lessons for K-5

- These are no-prep worksheets that are ready to go whenever you need them. Just print and copy. Most of the pages have a pet theme.
- The first two pages are suggested websites that a substitute might want to use with the class. The second page is a list of pet themed books that a substitute can use to go along with some of the worksheets.
- The worksheets include a pet mini-book, cut and paste activities and writing pages and reading comprehension. There are a few graphic organizers that can be used with any book. There are also two activity grids with 9 different activities students can choose from during a class period.


Time filler and brain break cards


These cards have quick ideas and discission prompts that a substitute can pull

directions/movement activities.




- 3 sheets for K/I, 2/3 and 4/5.


Tips on how to handle behavior issues..

- Review the posted library rules with students. Rules can be found (insert text). Remind students that you will be reporting their behavior to their classroom teacher and to the librarian.
- · Review with students your expectations right from the start.
- If one student is being disruptive and preventing the other students from working than move that student to a different spot. If the probles, continues, give them a think sheet to fill out to help them reflect on their behavior. Collect the sheet and leave it for me so I may talk to the student when I return.
- If the whole class is misbehaving, then stop the activity. Ask students to
 explain what the problem behavior was and why it was inappropriate. Ask
 them what they should have been doing. Give them another chance to
 complete the activity. If they are still having problems, stop the activity
 again. You can provide students with a think sheet or give them blank
 paper and have them write down the library rules.
- Pull out one of the brain break or time filler cards. This will help to re-focus
 the students and to use up some of their excess energy so they can
 concentrate on their work.


