

PREVIEW - Library Introduction/Orientation Google Slides Game

This is a self-checking game to introduce your students to the library and review different library topics, rules and procedures. The questions are mix of true or false and multiple choice. Students do not need a Google account to do this game. However you can still share the link through Google Classroom or other LMS. If students are doing the game at home, you could play it during a Zoom or live lesson. Then as students work through each question you can discuss the answers with them. You can also play it as a whole-group in the classroom or library.

I also included questions about social distancing, greeting classmates safely and how library will be different this year due to the coronavirus.

All the questions can be changed to suit your needs. I know how important this is, especially this school year. I have created a chart of the questions and answers. You MUST follow the instructions in order to edit the questions. ONLY change the text. If you change too many things, you might cause the game to not work correctly. Always have a copy of the presentation as a back-up.
