


Suggested Timeline for a full week of Black History Month Biography Lessons

| Day of the Week | Lesson Plan | Resources Needed |

| Monday | Introduce Black History Month with a K-W-L Activity or Lesson Hook about It Complete one reading comprehension biography figure with whole class to set expectations (Estimated Time: 25-27 minutes) | A way to project the biography & answer key on the board for all students Copies of biographies for each student |
| Tuesday | Review procedures taught yesterday with an anchor chart 0R write on the whiteboard Complete the 2 timeline worksheets to accompany the biography person you read yesterday with students (Estimated Time: 25-27 minutes) For fast finishers, have an activity planned while the others finish. | A way to project the timelines & answer keys on the board for all students to see Anchor Chart or board surface to write on Timelines for each student |
| Wednesday | Introduce a new biography person with students: either as a whole group lesson or break into partners You can also use these reading passages as a special center activity for February Day Three Work (Estimated Time: 25 minutes) | Same materials from Monday |
