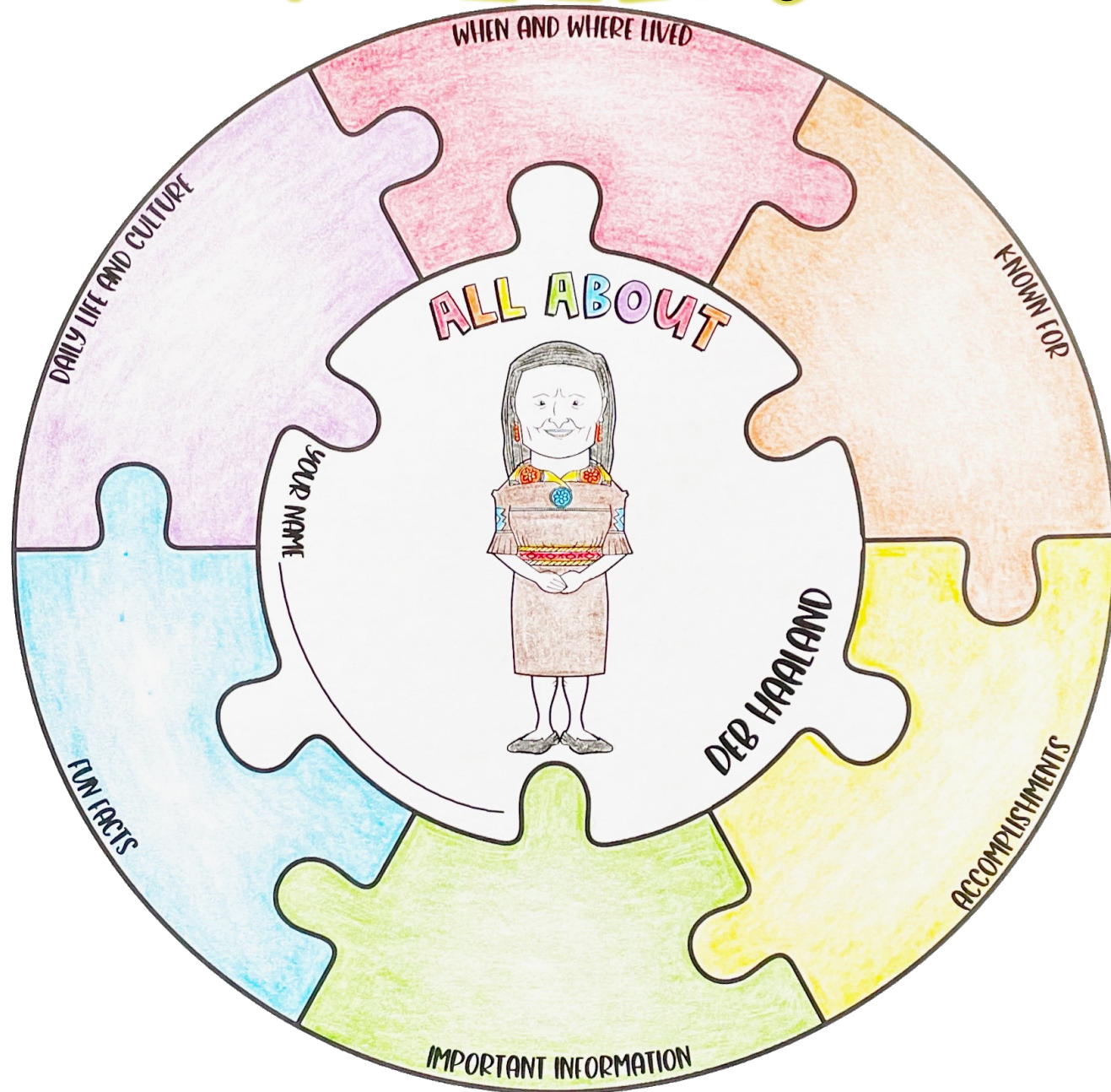


NATIVE AMERICAN PUZZLES



TEACHER'S PAGE

Thank you so much for your purchase!

First, **DECIDE** if you want your students to complete the small puzzle or the large puzzle. The large puzzle requires students to cut out individual pieces and assemble it. However, it allows for larger handwriting by providing more space. The smaller puzzle is on one page and does not require assembling, but it doesn't provide as much room for writing. Your students would need to write smaller or provide less information. Then, decide if you are going to assign all students with the same person or provide each student with a different person. Then go through the document and pull out who you need to print.

The **SMALLER PUZZLE** is all on one page and states along the top left corner that it is the smaller version. You'll find these on pages 3 – 39 in alphabetical order by the first name. Page 40 is a blank version of the small puzzle. This is so you can have students create a puzzle based on a person not included.

The **LARGER PUZZLE** is also stated up in the top left corner, but it requires three pages per puzzle. The middle piece is the only piece that is different from all the other pieces. The people provided begin on page 41 and continue until page 77. Page 78 is a blank middle piece where students can add their own person and illustrate her. Pages 79 and 80 are the outer ring puzzle pieces that will need to be assembled to the center piece that you have provided each student. Pages 81 and 82 are the same pieces, but with lines.

Have students write information in the puzzle pieces related to the heading and then color the pieces. For the larger puzzle, have students assemble it by taping the back or gluing it to a larger piece of construction paper.

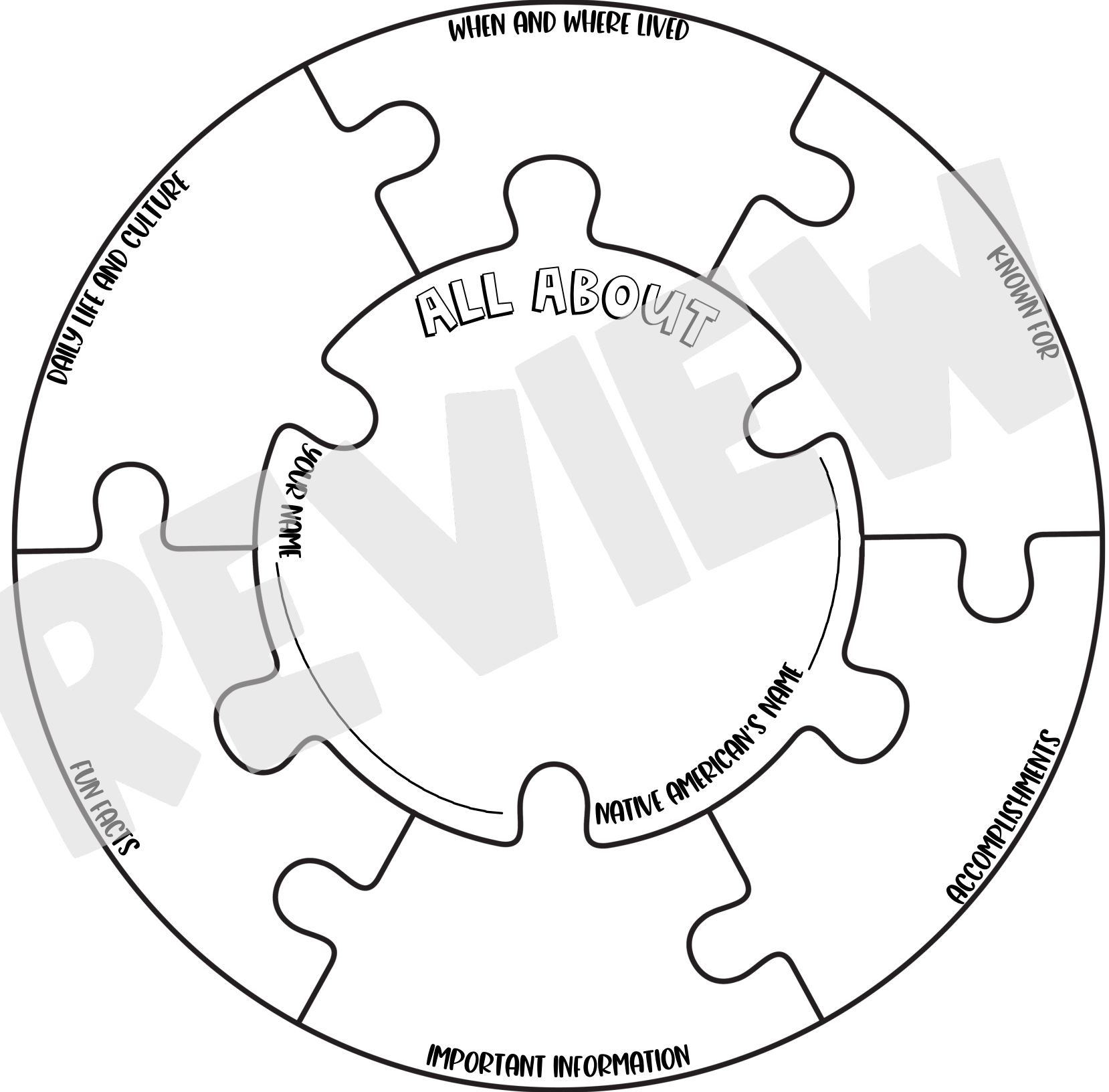

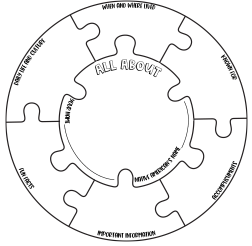

- 3.) If room, add illustrations. Then color the puzzle pieces.



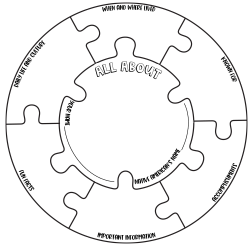
