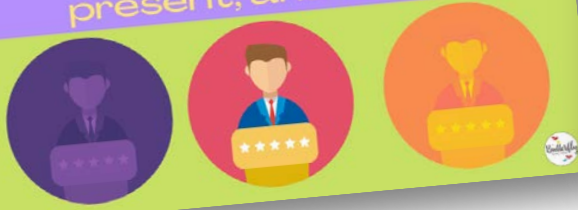


### 3 Forming a New Government
