**Chinese New Year**

In America, people enjoy celebrating New Year's on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Other countries also enjoy New Year's celebrations, but with many differences. One of the most celebrated Chinese holidays is the Chinese New Year. Each year, the Chinese New Year lasts for 15 days beginning on the first day of the Chinese solar-lunar calendar. This usually falls between January 21 and February 20. In China, the first seven days of the Chinese New Year is a holiday with time off for the whole country!

Chinese citizens and visitors enjoy new year rituals or traditions like going to parades and parties where people perform the Dragon Dance. Another tradition is to give out red envelopes with money to young children or recently married couples as a symbol of good luck. Red is a dominant color because Chinese people believe it represents good fortune and sends away evil spirits.

People also clean their houses to remove any bad luck from the previous year. Popping firecrackers is also a popular tradition because the loud noises are believed to scare off any evil spirits. How many differences can you find between America and China's New Year's holidays?

**Will You Be My Valentine?**

Valentine's Day is a time to celebrate feelings of love for others. Each year, on February 14th, people celebrate friendships and relationships by sharing cards, candy, and special dates. Although Valentine's Day is celebrated by many, it is not an official holiday that allows people time off from work or school.

Historians aren't sure how Valentine's Day started, but there are three people named Saint Valentine's in the Catholic religion. Historians believe that Valentine's Day could have begun sometime in the Middle Ages, but they did not do it for romantic love. In the 1300s, a poet named Geoffrey Chaucer wrote a poem about Valentine's Day with a love theme. After this, it became a trendy or popular holiday. Several years later, Cupid was added to Valentine's Day celebrations. Cupid is a Roman symbol in mythology that states when his arrow hits people, it



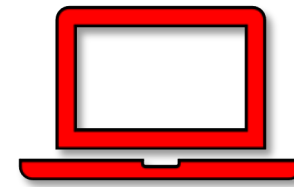
