

ANCIENT ROME

Ancient Rome was founded approximately 1000 years before that time, so the history of Rome is not quite known. Sometimes the stories are based on history while other stories are based on myths.

Historians have determined that Rome began around 1000 BC on Palatine Hill. Six other hills were settled as well the Aventine, Caelian, Capitol, Esquiline, and Viminal. Augustus, Marc Antony, Cicero and the most wealthy and famous Romans eventually settled in Rome, Italy.

Mythology states that the twins Romulus and Remus founded Rome in 753 BC. The myth says that the twin brothers Romulus and Remus became the first king of Rome. Some think the name Rome comes from Romulus' name.

The first settlers in Rome included Latin people. Greeks and the Sabines also settled in Rome, as did the Etruscans.

Romulus and Remus, the Roman god of war, had twin boys Romulus and Remus, with Rhea, a princess mortal. Other gods plotted to kill the twin boys because they were jealous of Mars and Rhea. Mars was away and Rhea needed to protect her boys. She set them in a basket floating in a stream. A female wolf found them like they were her own cubs. Her son was raised by a shepherd and his wife. Eventually, he became the ruler of the whole city. They had a contest to see who would be king. When it seemed that Remus was about to win, Romulus killed him with a rock, becoming the first king of Rome.

Augustus Augustus, born Gaius Octavian, established the Roman Empire. As a young man, Octavian (his name until later life) joined Julius Caesar's army. Caesar adopted Octavian since he had no children of his own, he adopted him and named him heir to the throne.

Julius Caesar was assassinated on March 15, 44 BC. Marc Antony, a relative of Caesar and famous general wanted to be the dictator. After clashing with Octavian, they finally agreed to a truce with Lepidus, called the Second Triumvirate. Octavian, Marc Antony, and Lepidus shared power in Rome.

The Triumvirate later battled for power. Lepidus was defeated so his troops joined Octavian. Meanwhile, Marc Antony joined forces with Queen Cleopatra of Egypt. Octavian then defeated both Cleopatra and Marc Antony and Cleopatra committed suicide. Octavian became the ruler and emperor of Rome. He didn't call himself king. Instead, he thought of himself as Princeps Civitatis, meaning First Citizen. At this time, the Senate changed his title to Augustus. His reign brought out peace and rebirth. This time period is called Pax Romana, meaning "peace of Rome". The month of August is named after Augustus.


