Europe is one of the seven continents on Earth. It is the second smallest continent (Australia is the smallest) spanning 3,930 million square miles. Europe is home to over 748 million people, making it the third most populated continent following Asia and Africa. Europe is composed of 50 countries.

The European continent is located entirely in the Northern Hemisphere so that means all its land mass sits above the equator. The farthest northern country in Europe is Russia, but the country of Russia spans parts of the European continent as well as the Asian continent. The borders of Europe are not very clear. Some people combine the continents of Europe and Asia and call it Eurasia. Five countries share a border in Europe and Asia: Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Russia, and Turkey. Europe is bordered by the Mediterranean Sea to the south, the Arctic Ocean to the north, Asia to the east, and the Atlantic Ocean to the west.

Russia is the largest European country with 146 million people. While not all the people in Russia live in Europe, the capital city of Russia is in Europe. Moscow has more than 13 million people and it is the largest city in Europe. Russia takes up forty percent of Europe's land area.

The smallest country in Europe is Vatican City. Vatican City is entirely surrounded by the city of Rome in Italy. Only about 500 people live in Vatican City home, and it is only about 121 acres.

There is no desert in Europe. The largest ice cave in the world is in the Salzburg Tennen Mountains, also known as the Werferenferner Grotte. Dune du Pilat is the largest sand dune on the coast of France. The Great Hungarian Plain is the largest flatland in southeastern Europe and features several small forests and large pastures.

The highest mountain in Europe is Mount Elbrus in Russia. The Caucasus Mountain Range and stands 18,510 feet tall.
