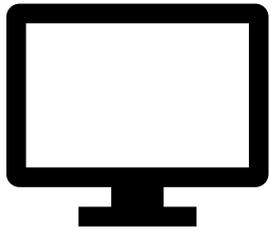

PAUL REVERE

Paul Revere was born in 1734 in Boston, Massachusetts. His father was a silversmith and Paul would later follow in his footsteps and become a silversmith as well. In 1754, Paul's father passed away and Paul was forced to take over the family business. In the shop, he engraved metal, made surgical instruments and sold spectacles, silverware and tea sets. During tough times, Revere would clean teeth. He was taught by his surgeon friend, Doctor Joseph Warren. Paul was an excellent horse rider and also carried messages between Boston, New York, and Philadelphia. After returning from a short time in the army for the French and Indian War, Revere married Sarah Orne.

In 1765 the Stamp Act was passed. The British Parliament began to tax the colonists to help pay for the debt from the French and Indian War. The Stamp Act taxed all paper documents in the colonies such as newspapers and playing cards. The colonists insisted that the act was unconstitutional since there was no one in the British government to represent them.

Paul Revere became an active member of the Sons of Liberty. The Sons of Liberty was a group of American Patriots who wanted liberty for the colonies. The purpose of the secret society was to protect the rights of colonists and to fight the unfair taxes from the British government. The group organized protests to argue against British rule. Their motto was "No taxation without representation." Other famous members included John Adams, Samuel Adams, Patrick Henry, and John Hancock.

Tensions grew between the British troops and the townspeople of Boston when snowballs, sticks and rocks were thrown at British soldiers. In March of 1770, the British army fired into a crowd of American protesters, killing five. This event is known as the Boston Massacre. Revere created an engraving of the event that placed the blame on the British soldiers. His engraving portrayed an angry mob of British soldiers firing into a crowd of innocent colonists. His copper engraving was called The Bloody Massacre in King Street. In an effort to persuade other colonists to oppose British rule, Revere's famous engraving was produced just three weeks later. Even though his poster was inaccurate, the American colonists blamed the British for the death of the 5 colonists. His copper engraving made Americans even more upset with the British and fueled their desire for independence.

The Boston Tea Party occurred in 1773. To protest the tax on tea, Paul Revere and other Sons of Liberty boarded three British trade ships in the harbor.

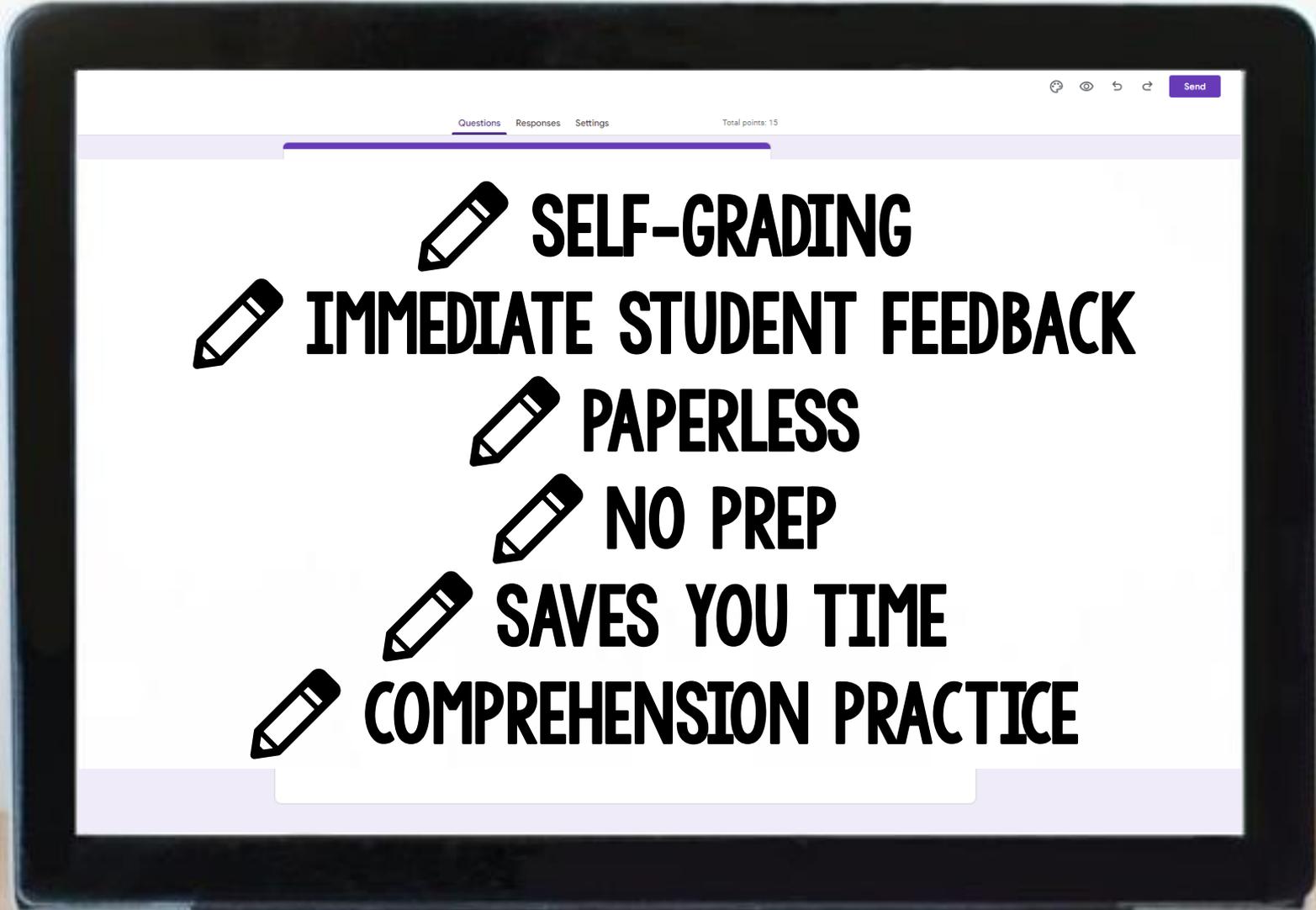
