The French and Indian War began in 1754. The French and Indian War took place between the American colonies and New France. In this war, French troops helped American colonists fight. The American colonies won the war, but only because they had help from British soldiers. King George III of England spent a lot of money on the war. He bought expensive supplies in order to protect the colonies. King George III felt that the American colonists should pay for the cost of the war.

As the British government became more involved with the colonies, tensions increased. In 1764, the British government thought it was best to create new laws and taxes for the colonists. The British government, known as Parliament, decided to pass the Sugar Act.

England was far away from the American colonies. The colonists didn't want people all the way across the ocean telling them what to do or how to live.

After the Boston Massacre, the British started collecting a new tax on tea. Three British trade ships named the Dartmouth, the Elmer, and the Beaver sat in the Boston harbor for weeks because their tea delivery wasn't being allowed because the colonists of Boston refused to buy tea because the English tax was too high. Their anger was directed at Great Britain, which had passed the Tea Act. The Tea Act was a law that required American colonists to buy their tea from the British owned East India Company.

Leading Boston patriots protested this tax by boarding the British ships and dumping 342 chests of tea into the Boston Harbor. They dressed up as Mohawk Indians. This was known as the Boston Tea Party.

A group of colonists named the Sons of Liberty was determined to let the British know they were unhappy. The Sons of Liberty included John Hancock, Paul Revere, and Sam Adams.

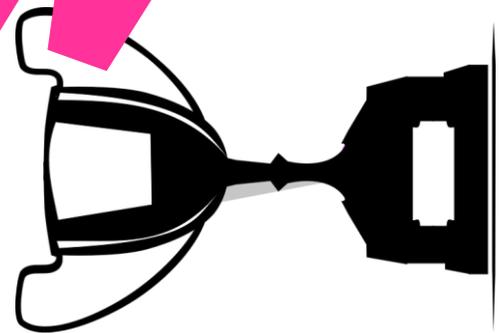

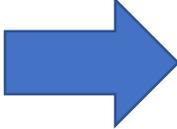
