

GEORGE WASHINGTON

George Washington, America's first president, was born on February 22, 1732 in Virginia. He was originally a British Colonel then became General of the United States during the Revolutionary War. Washington led the Continental Army to a victory in the Revolutionary War.

He got his first job and license from the College of William and Mary. He became the first official land surveyor for Culpeper County. After multiple deaths in the family, Washington became the sole heir to the Mount Vernon estate.

George lived with his wife Martha at Mount Vernon. Martha Custis was a wealthy woman with two children. Washington never had children of his own. As George grew older he lost his teeth. He wore false teeth made of ivory and silver. Many people mistakenly believe that his dentures were made out of wood.

In the 1750s, Washington was appointed to lead the local Virginia militia. At that time, the French refused to leave land that was claimed by Britain. This eventually led to the French and Indian War. George Washington, joined by forty men, led a surprise attack on Fort Duquesne. The French, led by Joseph Jumonville, returned fire using muskets but quickly surrendered.

George Washington started his military career during the French and Indian War. Washington had strong leadership skills but his army was made up of colonial farmers. They did not have enough supplies and were not very well trained. He lost more battles than he won.

In 1758, Washington was elected to Virginia's House of Burgesses. A few years later, England's Parliament began taxing American colonists with the Stamp Act and the Townshend Act. Washington believed a way to show disapproval for the taxes would be to boycott the British goods. He introduced his idea to Virginia's House of Burgesses.

Due to his activism in politics, he was chosen to be a delegate in the First Continental Congress. The disputes between Britain and colonial Americans continued and as a result the battles of Lexington and Concord occurred in 1775. Two months later, Washington was appointed as the Commander-in-Chief of the military during the Revolutionary War.

He defeated the British when he led the Continental Army across the icy




