**BILL OF RIGHTS**

The Bill of Rights: The US Constitution has 27 amendments. The first ten amendments are known as the Bill of Rights. The Bill of Rights was ratified (approved) in 1791. The first ten amendments of the US Constitution outline the basic rights and freedoms of all Americans. It put limits on what the government could do and control.

Amendment 1: The First Amendment is made up of five parts. Those parts include freedoms of religion, assembly, press, petition and speech. Freedom of Religion allows Americans to believe and practice whatever religion they choose. Federal and state governments are not allowed to establish an official religion (Establishment Clause). Freedom of the Press allows people to publish their opinions and the government cannot stop them. Press includes newspapers, internet, TV and radio, etc. Freedom of Petition means that you can request change from the government. The Freedom of Assembly is the right to gather in groups for any reason, so long as they are peaceful. The Freedom of Speech allows individuals to say what is on their mind but there are limitations such as shouting "FIRE" in a crowded movie theatre. Founding Fathers did not want their new government to keep people from voicing their opinions.

Amendment 2: The Second Amendment guarantees the right to bear arms, or protects the right to own guns. The Second Amendment has become a controversial issue for many Americans. The original intent of this amendment was to help the people protect themselves from an abusive government or tyrant. To "bear arms" means to carry a weapon or gun. It is the right for a person to keep a weapon and use it to protect themselves.

Amendment 3: The Third Amendment prevents the government from forcing citizens to quarter, or house, soldiers in their private homes. This amendment was a result of the Quartering Act during the Revolutionary War. During the war, King George III forced colonists to give his soldiers a place to sleep and food to eat. Today, the government cannot place soldiers in your home during a time of war or a time of peace.

Amendment 4: The Fourth Amendment protects the privacy of Americans. It prohibits, or prevents, any unreasonable search or seizure of personal property. A search warrant is issued by a judge after reviewing the




