


The Oregon Trail was a very difficult journey because it was a path through the existing landscape and rugged terrain. Many travelers carved their names in stones along the trail. A large granite stone in Wyoming called Independence Rock had thousands of signatures.

Part of the struggle of the Oregon Trail was the five-month journey that had to be endured. Planning travel for months along the trail left several things to be considered. Pioneers had to plan for all types of eather, how they would find enough food, and take care of the needs of their family on the trip. That meant hundreds of pounds of dry groceries like sugar, flour, salt, bacon, and coffee. It also meant they needed to pack ammunition and weapons so they could hunt for






