

St. Patrick's Day was named the "Friendliest" Day of the the Guinness Book of World Records. The fountain in front of White House is often dyed green in honor of the day. A major in Chicago has also been dyed green to celebrate the holiday.

Irish immigrants began celebrating St. Patrick's Day in Boston in 1737. Legends say finding a four-leaf clover will bring you good luck. The first leaf represents hope, the second symbolizes faith, the third leaf is love and the fourth represents luck.

A leprechaun is a small Irish fairy that makes shoes. He wears green pointed shoes, a hat and a leather apron. Many believe that leprechauns live alone in the forest. Supposedly, they are unfriendly and spend their day guarding their treasures.

Leprechauns store their coins in a pot-of-gold hidden at the end of a rainbow. Many believe that if a person captures a leprechaun but looks away, the leprechaun will disappear and so will his

treasure


