TEXT MARKING

After answering each question, students will find evidence in the text to support their answer.

JULIUS CAESAR

On July 12th in the year 100 BCE, Gaius Julius Caesar was born. He was given the same name as his father, who was a Praetor, or a judge, for the province of Asia in Apulia. From an early age, Julius Caesar's parents taught him about the democratic form of government that promoted more representation for lower classes of people. Caesar was born to a family of senators around the age of six. At the age of 16, he was educated in Rome. Julius Caesar decided to go into the priesthood to support his family.

Caesar was nominated as the high priest of the Roman god Jupiter, the king of all the other gods, the equivalent of the Greek god Zeus, and married Cornelia. Then, the Roman ruler Sulla proclaimed himself dictator of Rome. Because of his belief in giving more representation to lower class citizens of Rome, Caesar was run out of the country. Sulla also ordered Caesar to divorce Cornelia because her family was an enemy. Caesar refused and was targeted as an enemy. His mother's family smoothed over his return to Rome, but Caesar lost his position and joined the army.

Caesar proved himself to be an excellent soldier. Because of his bravery and valor, Caesar was promoted and successful. However, when Sulla died, he left the army and went back to Rome to try his hand at being an orator, an lawyer.

In Rome, Caesar was elected as a military tribune with many administrative duties behind the scenes to help the military run well. His wife Cornelia died at the same time, so he remarried a woman named Calpurnia. Caesar made powerful friends and earned enough money through their friendship and money to be promoted. In 65 BCE, he was elected his wife and his new position as Praetor, or judge, in Spain. Caesar used his military ability to bring peace to the area.
