




The new government would eventually be modeled after the Virginia Plan, written by James Madison. Progress was slow. Some states were concerned about how senators would be elected. Some states wanted one president, while others wanted the power to be divided amongst three people. An agreement called The Great Compromise allowed the number of representatives in the House Representatives to be based on the state's population, while the Senate would have two representatives per state.


