

JAMESTOWN

King James I of England financed an expedition to establish a new colony in North America. The king hoped that this new colony would prevent Spain from claiming new land. He also wanted to be the first country to find a sailing route to Asia. The king granted approval for businessmen, called the Virginia Company, to explore and settle new land. In 1606, King James I gave the Virginia Company the charter to establish a new colony. The Virginia Company was financed by private investors who expected a return on their investment. They expected to find gold in the New World. They also had hopes of making money by growing and making things in the new colony that they could ship back to England.

The crew set sail on December 20, 1606 and the journey took four months. The expedition included 104 men. The ships were named the Godspeed, Susan Constant and the Discovery. Captain Christopher Newport oversaw the three ships. The three ships first sailed to the Canary Islands. They then landed in Puerto Rico to stop for fresh food and water. From there, the ships headed north and landed at Cape Henry in Virginia on April 26, 1607.

They landed near the Chesapeake Bay area on the banks of the James River. After landing in Virginia, the English settlers were attacked by a Native American tribe. They were angry that the men were using their land. The settlers knew they needed protection so they built a triangular shaped fort to defend themselves from all directions. They named the new area Jamestown in honor of King James I of England. Jamestown was the first permanent English settlement in North America. Edward Wingfield was the colony's first governor. He allowed the men to search for gold instead of establishing a settlement.

The settlers had a difficult time in Jamestown. The climate and soil were different than England's. The location of Jamestown was chosen because settlers felt they could easily defend it against potential attacks. In the long run, the site chosen for the fort later proved to be a disaster. The men arrived in late summer and were unable to plant crops to have food to eat. In summer months, the land turned into swamps, poisonous waters full of mosquitoes. In winter months, there was no protection from the harsh weather elements. Jamestown Colony was established in the middle of the Paspahegh territory.


