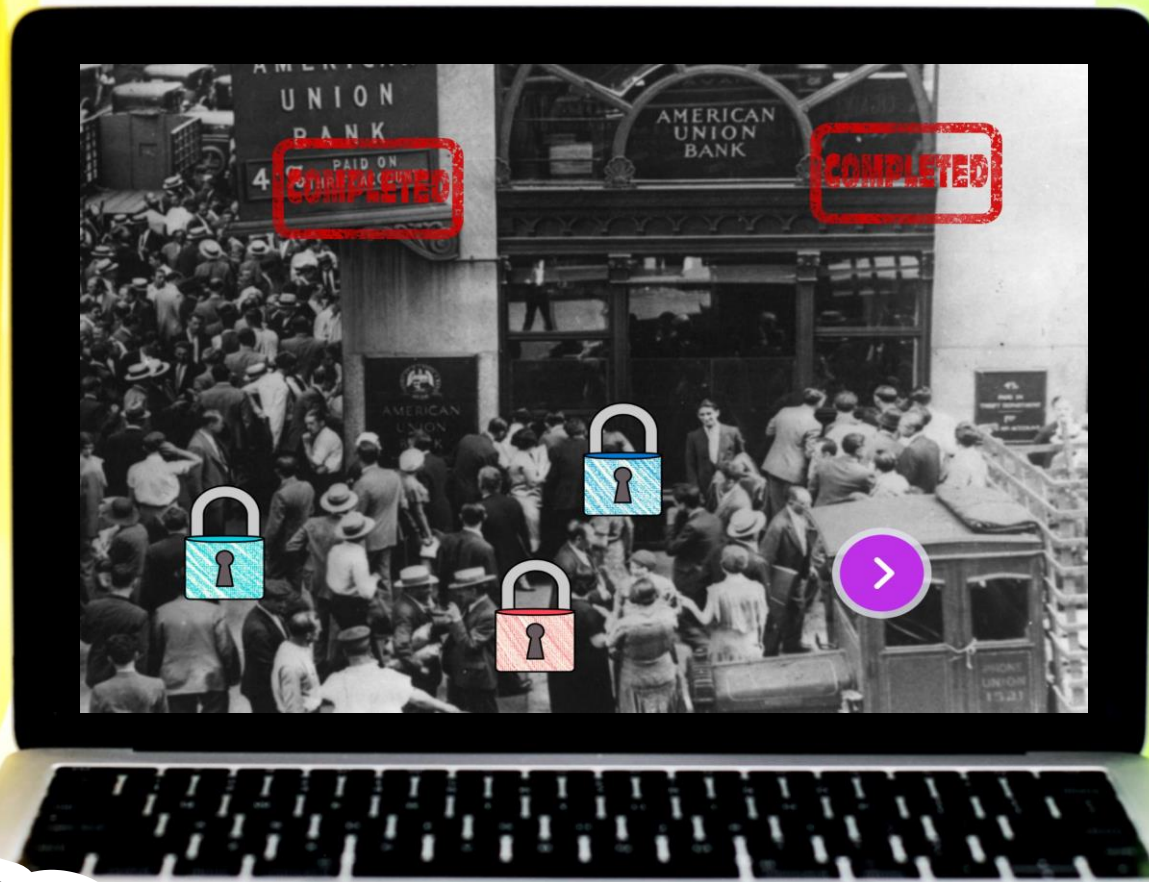



Students will read 6 short passages about the topic,
then answer questions.



Many terrible things happened as a result of the Great Depression and the failure of banks. The unemployment rate went up to about 25% from the previous 3%. That means about 13 million people did not have a job, and those who did were not getting paid what they were before. One thing that led to less jobs was the booming economy in the 1920s (known as the Roaring 20s), which led to companies making too many products. This high supply but lack of demand meant too many products were being made but not enough were being sold. The Great Depression hit, and many workers were laid off (lost their job) because companies stopped making more products. The lack of jobs led to the average American household income to go down drastically by almost 40%. Many could not afford their house payments and were evicted (forced out).
