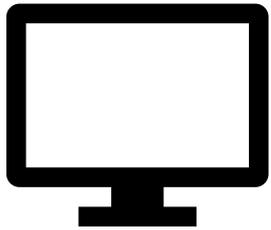

FAMOUS ARTISTS #4

Georgia O'Keeffe was born on November 15, 1887 in Sun Prairie, Wisconsin. From the age of twelve, she knew she wanted to be an artist. She is known for her unusual and beautiful flower paintings. Some people call her the "Mother of American modernism".

O'Keeffe's most famous works include Blue and Green Music, Cow's Skull: Red, White, and Blue, Red Canna, Black Iris and Oriental Poppies. She attended the Art Institute of Chicago in 1905 and the Art Students League in New York in 1908.

O'Keeffe's art was first exhibited in 1916 by the famous photographer Alfred Steiglitz. She was also the first woman to be given an independent exhibition by the Museum of Modern Art. O'Keeffe's painting Jimson Weed/White Flower No. 1 sold for over \$44 million in 2011.

Her flower paintings were colorful, feminine and very detailed. The paintings were the actual size of the flower. She created more than 200 paintings of flowers. Georgia tried to express her emotions in her art. She was inspired by the landscapes of New York City and New Mexico. She rarely signed her paintings.

Raffaello Sanzio da Urbino was born on April 6, 1483 in Urbino, Italy. He was considered to be one of the most highly regarded painters of the Italian High Renaissance Classicism period. His most famous works include The School of Athens, The Sistine Madonna and The Transfiguration.

Raphael became an apprentice to master painter Pietro Vannucci in 1500 for four years. In 1504, Raphael moved to Florence and studied the art of Leonardo da Vinci, Masaccio and Michelangelo. Michelangelo, at one point in time, felt that Raphael plagiarized his work.

Starting in 1501, Raphael painted numerous religious pieces including Mond Crucifixion, The Three Graces, The Knight's Dream and Marriage of the Virgin. For the next few years, he painted a series of Madonnas.

In 1508, Raphael moved to Rome. Pope Julius II asked him to paint "Stanza" in the Vatican. Raphael later painted frescos in the Vatican. Fresco is a unique technique where a wall is plastered and painted at the same time.


