**JANE GOODALL**  
British primatologist and anthropologist known for her years of study of chimpanzees. She made important discoveries that were never before made in the study of primates. Goodall spent 40 years of her life close to the wild in Africa observing, learning, and forming bonds. She was one of the first to show that primates are capable of using tools and that they have emotions. Her work encouraged others to pursue the study of primates).

She was born on April 3, 1934, in London, England. From a young age, she was interested in animals and their behavior. She was fascinated with Africa's wildlife and hoped to one day live among them. At the age of 23, she started working at a London-based documentary film company. When she was 23 years old, she was able to afford a trip. She went to a friend's farm where she continued working.
