READING #3

The Constitution has seven Articles (or sections) that describe how the United States government works.

The first three articles define the powers of the three branches of government. The three branches are the legislative, executive and Judicial Branch. The Constitution made sure that no one branch of the government could have too much power. This is called "Checks and Balances."

The introduction paragraph is called the Preamble. The first three words are "We the people." The Preamble is the first part of the Constitution even though it was written last.

Benjamin Franklin, James Madison, Alexander Hamilton and George Washington were some of the Founding Fathers of the Constitution. James Madison is known as the "Father of the Constitution."

The Preamble was written during the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia.

America's first Constitution was actually called the Articles of Confederation, which was passed in 1781. The Articles of Confederation had some major issues or weaknesses. The biggest issue was that it did not give Congress the power to collect taxes. The Constitution addressed or fixed all of the major weaknesses of the Articles of Confederation.

The U.S. Constitution was discussed secretly, behind locked doors that were guarded. It took over three months to actually "frame" the Constitution.

The Constitution says that the people elect the President, and the President enforces the laws. This is the role of the Executive Branch.

The Legislative Branch makes the laws. The lawmakers are known as Congress. Congress has two parts: the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Judicial Branch interprets the laws and includes the Supreme Court. They decide if a person got a fair trial.



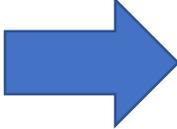
