They settled along the coast and in the interior. The colonies had different ways of life and different types of people. Some colonies allowed for freedom of religion while others did not. One place where they could practice their religion was called Williamsburg. The colony in America was called Virginia and it was created to 1607.

DESERTS: The Atacama Desert in Chile is considered one of the driest places on Earth. The Patagonian Desert is Argentina's largest desert. Other deserts include the Sechura Desert, Monte Desert, and the Guadalupe Desert.

PREMIUMS: The highest peaks are
Aconcagua in the Andes Mountains in Argentina.
Other mountain ranges include Sierra Nevada de
Santa Marta, Sierra de Córdoba and
Wilhelmina Mountains.

WATER: Amazon River, Parana River, Orinoco River, Tocantins River, Strait of Magellan, Lake Titicaca, Lake Maracaibo. The highest waterfall in the world is Santo del Angel (also called Angel Falls). Lake Maracaibo is the biggest lake in South America. The Amazon Rain Forest is the largest rainforest in the world.

NATURAL RESOURCES: South America is very rich in mineral resources including copper, iron, gold, and silver.

CULTURE: The Incan Civilization was a powerful force in South America before Spain and Portugal colonized most of the continent. Music and dance have always been a big influence across the region. The most famous celebration is Carnaval. Carnaval is a four-day celebration with folkloric dancers and singers in colorful costumes.

FOOD: Popular food dishes include arroz con camarones (Colombian rice pilaf with shrimp). Dulce de leche is a sweet caramel milk confection that tops muffins. Fried plantains, ceviche, empanadas, arepas and picarones are popular as well.

LANGUAGE: There are about one hundred fifty languages used in Brazil. Quechua is the language spoken by the Inca. It is the most common indigenous language. In Suriname, formerly a Dutch colony, the official language is still Dutch.


