AMELIA EARHART

... was a female American aviator. Earhart, nicknamed "Lady", was born in Kansas on July 24, 1897. She is most known for being the first woman to fly solo over the Atlantic Ocean. Amelia was a pioneer for women's rights and opportunities and had a keen fascination with aviation.

At an early age, Amelia was very adventurous. At the age of 12, she rode roller coaster with her sister Muriel, and claimed it was the scariest thing she'd ever done. Instead, they played basketball, and baseball. They also collected bugs and butterflies.

After high school, Amelia attended the Ogontz School of Nursing. She quit school to become a Red Cross Nurse's Aide during World War I. She treated wounded soldiers during World War I while watching the Royal Flying Corps practice. She took an interest in flying after attending an airplane ride with World War I pilot. Amelia began flying lessons with Neta Snook. By 1921, she had earned her pilot license. She nicknamed her airplane "The Canary". Finally, in October of 1927, she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. She received her Aeronautics Association license - her pilot license.

In 1928, Earhart joined two other pilotesses, Elsie Gandy, and Louise Gandy, to form the first all-female pilots at the time.

On June 17, 1931, Earhart departed Canada on June 17, 1931, on a flight to Stult and Louisville, Kentucky.

AMELIA EARHART

Amelia Earhart was a female American aviator. Earhart, nicknamed Lady Lindy, was born in Kansas on July 24, 1897. She is most known for being the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean. Amelia was an advocate for women's rights and had a strong fascination with aviation.

From a young age, she was very adventurous. At the age of 7, she built a flying machine with her sister Muriel, and claimed it was like their sisters weren't into "girly" things. Instead, they played sports - football, basketball, and baseball. They also collected bugs and frogs, and even shot a rifle.

After high school, Amelia attended the Ogontz School in Pennsylvania, but she quit school to become a Red Cross Nurse's Aide in Toronto, Canada. She treated wounded soldiers during World War I. She spent her free time watching the Royal Flying Corps practice.

She took an interest in flying after attending an airshow. Later that day, she went on an airplane ride with World War I pilot Frank Hawks. At only a few hundred feet in the air, she knew she had to fly more. So, Amelia began flying lessons with Neta Snook. By 1921 she bought her first airplane, a Kinner Airstar airplane. She nicknamed her bright yellow airplane "The Canary". Finally, in October of 1922, she earned her National Aeronautics Association pilot license - her pilot license. She was one of only 16 female pilots at the time.

Earhart was one of two other pilots on a flight across the Atlantic Ocean. She was a passenger on the flight. She crossed Canada on June 17 as a passenger aboard a seaplane called the Friendship. Wilmer Stultz and Louis Gordon piloted the plane. They landed in Wales on June 18th. Although she did not fly the plane, she was the first woman to fly over the Atlantic. The trip took just 20 hours. Amelia became well known after the trip.
