CARD #5 Senators serve a six-year term. The Senator can serve as many terms as they like because there is no term limit, as long as they are re-elected. Every two years, an election for Senators is held. In this election, only one-third of the Senators will be voted on. This means that the elections are staggered for the Senate. Representatives serve a two-year term. There are also no term limits in the House of Representatives, as long as they are re-elected. SIX ELECTION LIMIT

If both houses vote on the bill and it gets approved, then it goes to the President. The President can do two things with a bill. He/She can either sign it into law or veto (reject) it. If the President vetoes it, then it goes back to Congress. Congress, then, can override the veto with a twothirds vote. This system ensures that no part of the Legislative Branch can become too powerful.






