In 1511, Ponce de Leon was removed from his leadership position because he was in a rebellion against one of the Spanish kings. He was sent as governor of Puerto Rico by Diego Columbus.

King Ferdinand ordered Ponce de Leon to find new islands to the west. The new islands were often called the Islands of Beninay. Many ships to Beninay were lost at sea. These ships were loaded with gold and pearls.

The crew of the ships were mostly Native Americans.

Ponce de Leon found Easter Island, which he called "Isla de Pascua," Juan de la Cosa. The island of Florida was a huge island, but the crew did not realize they were in North America.

The Muscovy Company hired Hudson in 1607 to find a northern passage to Asia. Henry believed he could find a passage to Asia via the North Pole. He believed that all the ice would melt and he could sail over the top of the world. They set off in their vessel, they sailed out of England and named the ship the Hopewell. They completed the voyage by sailing north, past Greenland to a land called Spitzbergen. They continued to sail north until battling icy conditions became too dangerous. They were forced to turn around and return to England.

In 1608, Hudson tried again. The second voyage was also paid for by the Muscovy Company. This time they traveled east. They managed to make it to the northern part of Russia but turned around due to ice.

Even after two failed attempts, Hudson found a company called the Dutch East India Company to pay for his third expedition in 1609.

Hudson decided to sail further south to James Bay, still looking for a passage to the Pacific Ocean.

The ship became trapped in frozen water. Ice forced him and his crew to spend the winter on land. They struggled to survive due to hunger, cold and disease. During this expedition he sailed through the Hudson Strait and the Hudson Bay.

Unfortunately, he never found a Northwest Passage. His crew wanted to return home but became angry, hungry and restless.

Hudson's crew ended up rebelling against him. They were sick, tired, hungry and wanted to go home. Henry, his son and a few crew members were set adrift in a small lifeboat into the Hudson Bay. The remaining crew then returned to Europe.

No one knows what happened to Henry Hudson but he was never seen again. Robert Juet sailed with Hudson and recorded the trips in his journals.


