


The Pony Express solved the problem. The Pony Express was founded on the idea that a single rider on a horse could deliver messages faster than any other way available at the time. The Pony Express could get messages from \$ Joseph, Missouri to Sacramento, California in 0 days. The owners of the Pony Express.

There were over 100 stations across the states of Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, and California. With stations about ten miles apart, riders would stop, eat, and get water.

There were 147 stations, 80 riders, and 400 \_\_\_.

They would also change tired horses for esh, well-rested horses so they didn't run any one horse too hard on the journey. In the mountains and on rougher terrain, the stations




