READING #1

Magellan and his ships first sailed the Canary Islands by crossing the Atlantic Ocean. They continued south towards Brazil.

During the expedition south, the weather began to get cold and the crew did not bring enough food.

Some of the sailors tried to steal three of Magellan's ships to get food. Magellan fought back. Magellan regained control of his fleet and the voyage continued south.

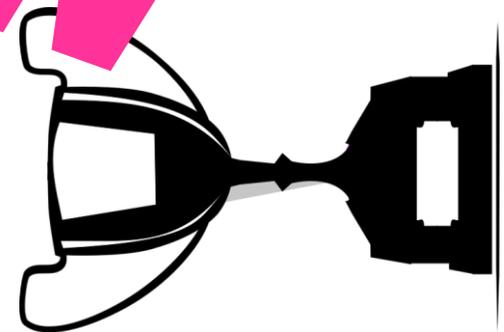

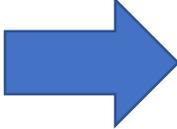
