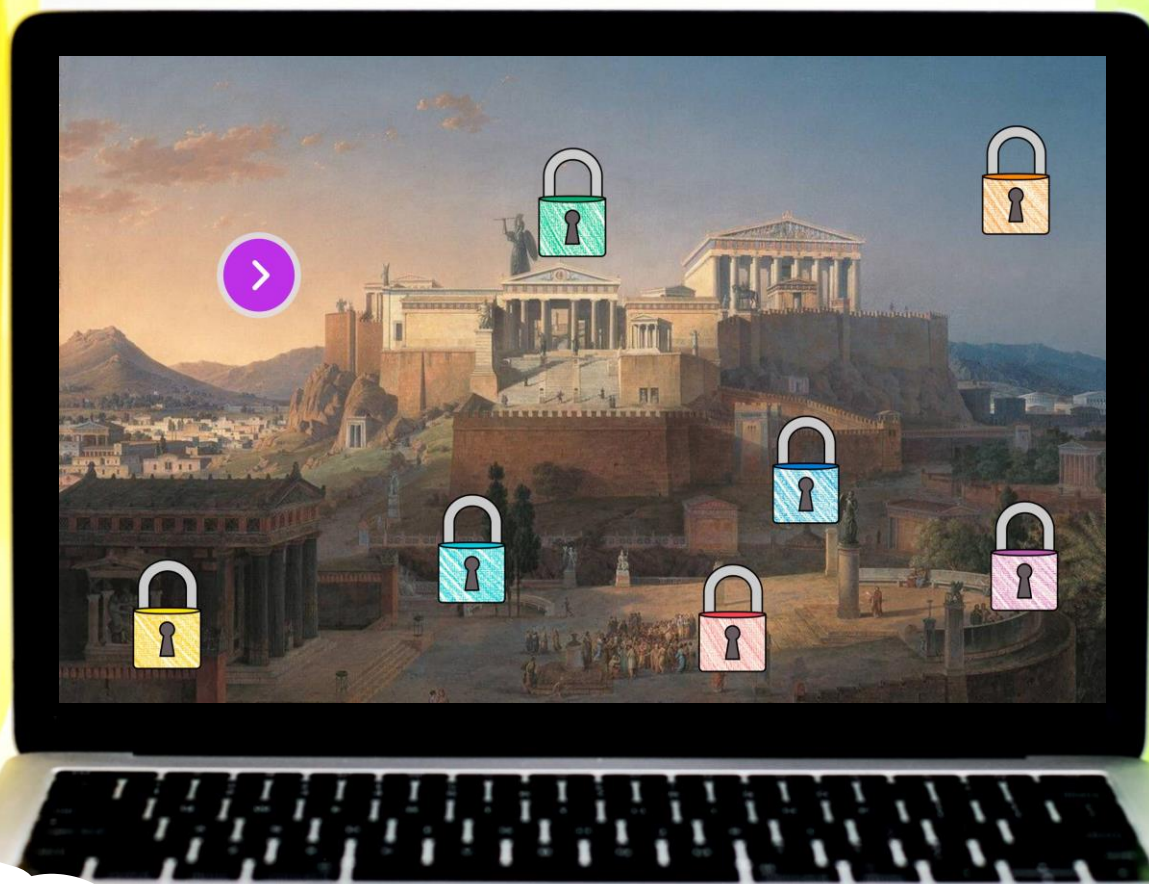

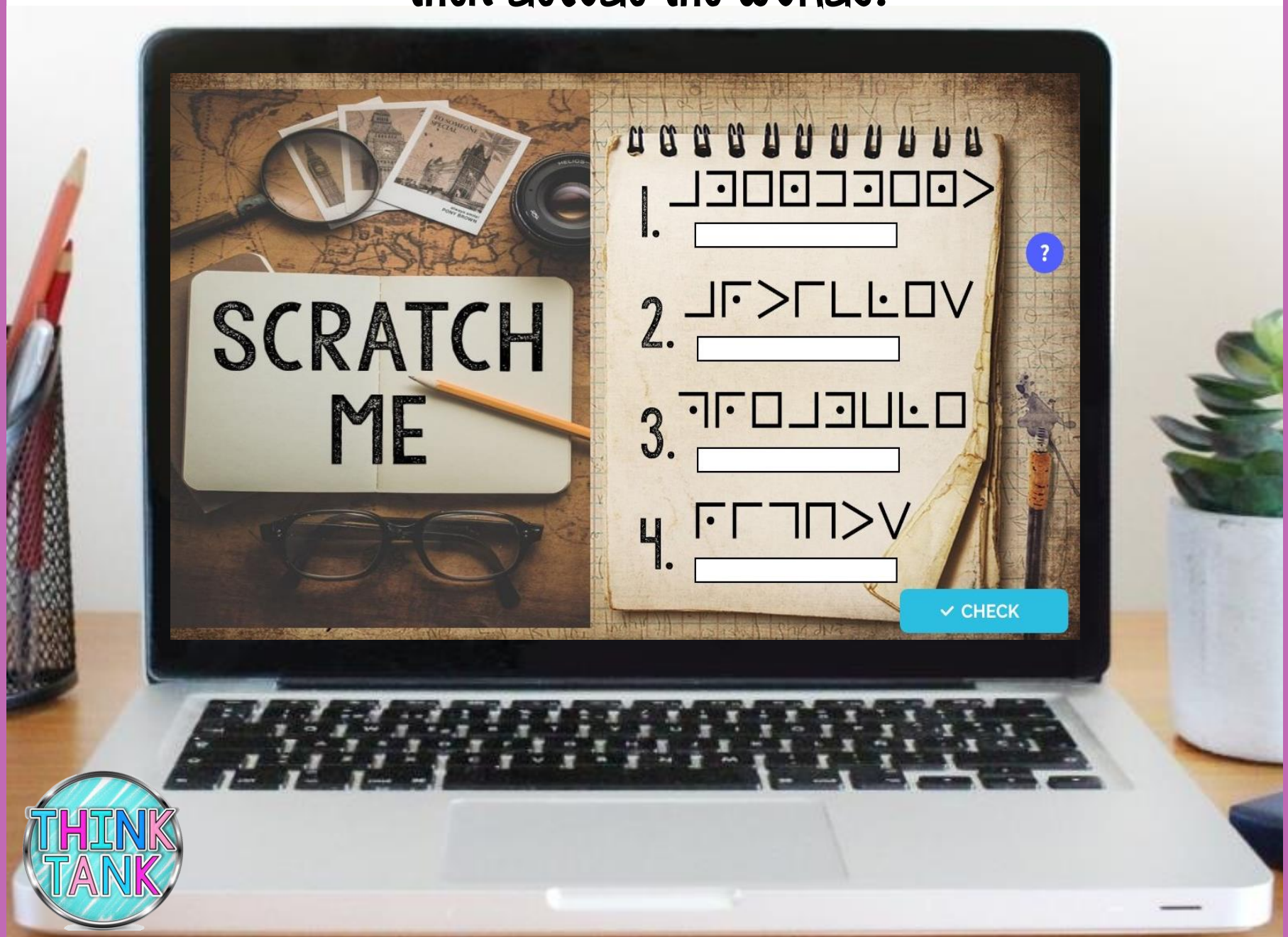

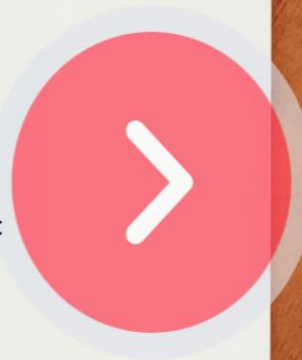


# 6 PASSAGES


Students will read 6 short passages about the topic,
