DID YOU KNOW?
The 26th Amendment lowered the voting age from 21 to 18. At the time, 18 year olds could be forced to serve in the military, but could not vote.

The U.S. Constitution was written in the same Pennsylvania State House where the Declaration of Independence was signed. "Pensylvania" is spelled wrong in the document.

The Constitution was signed on September 17th, 1787. The Constitution is the supreme law of the United States of America.

The Constitution has 4,400 words. It is the oldest and shortest written Constitution of any major government in the world.

The Constitution is stored in the National Archives Building in Washington, DC. All four copies are behind protective glass framed with titanium. The cases contain argon gas and are kept at 67 degrees to preserve the parchment's quality.

Over the past 230 years, more than 11,000 amendments, or changes, have been introduced in Congress.

As of 2019, twenty seven of those have received the necessary approval from the states to become an amendment.

The first ten amendments are called the Bill of Rights. Those ten amendments guarantee that U.S. citizens have their rights protected. The Bill of Rights was ratified in 1791.

LEXINGTON AND CONCORD

DID YOU KNOW?

In February 1775, Massachusetts was declared as a state of rebellion by Great Britain.

The first battles of the American Revolution were the Battles of Lexington and Concord. The battles were between the British soldiers and the American colonists. These battles took place in April, 1775. The British soldiers wanted to take away the weapons of the colonists. They also arrested John Hancock and Samuel Adams on the way to Concord. The battles were fought in towns outside Boston, Massachusetts. Fortunately, the patriots got knowledge of what was about to happen and were able to safely evacuate.

The first of the battles occurred in Lexington in what is known as Lexington Green. The dispute as to who fired the first shot has never been resolved. This is known as "the shot heard round the world."

The British soldiers, as led by General Braddock, marched to Lexington to find and destroy all hidden weapons. They were met by 70 minutemen. Minutemen were members of the American militia who volunteered to be ready for service at a minute's notice. The battle lasted just a few minutes but was very bloody. 8 minutemen were killed and 10 additional were hurt. Only one British soldier was injured in the process. From there, the soldiers moved forward to seize supplies such as food, guns, and ammunition that was stored by the militia. They were ambushed by 400 minutemen on their way back to Boston. This time the British had lost 250 soldiers while only 90 Americans died.

BATTLE OF BUNKER HILL

DID YOU KNOW?

General Prescott commanded his colonial troops to conserve ammunition.

The Battle of Bunker Hill was fought on June 17, 1775. It occurred in the early stages of the American Revolutionary War during what is known as the Siege of Boston. The battle is named after Bunker Hill which is in Charlestown, Massachusetts. Although the original objective of both colonial and British troops, most of the battle took place on a nearby hill known as Breed's Hill.

On June 17, 1775, the leaders of the colonial forces surrounded Breed's Hill. They also learned that the British were planning on sending troops to take ownership of the unoccupied hills that surrounded the city. Colonial leader William Prescott commanded his troops to occupy Bunker Hill and Breed's Hill in a way that they would not be caught.

By the beginning of the day, the British were made aware of the presence of the colonial forces and they attacked them later that day. The two assaults on the colonial soldiers resulted in significant British casualties. The colonists then retreated to Cambridge, which left the British in control of the peninsula. The British were led by William Howe.

The battle was tactical, or very carefully planned, though it was a victory for the British. That they gained control, it cost them a lot of lives. They lost a lot more lives in comparison to the Americans during this battle. Some lives lost include: General Joseph Warren and major Andrew McClary.
