TYPES OF GOVERNMENT

A government is a political system of rules that the people of a particular country or area must follow. There are many different types of governments throughout our world. The common goal of any government is the obtaining of political power.

Aristocracy, or monarchy, is a form of government where a small, privileged group of people is chosen to lead a country. In order to be an aristocrat, one must be chosen based on their education, family, or wealth. Common titles include duke, duchess, baron and baroness. Power is often passed down to the eldest surviving child.

A democratic government allows the citizens of the country to choose their own leaders. There are two main types of democracies: direct and representative. In a representative democracy, like the United States, citizens hold political power by electing representatives through voting. Representatives then make the laws and run the government on their behalf. Everyone has the same political rights regardless of their income, race, religion, etc.

In a direct democracy, there are no elected representatives. Citizens are directly involved in governing the country. Every member of society participates directly in the political process. Today, countries have too many people for a direct democracy to work.

A dictatorship is where the ruler maintains absolute power over the country and the military. Dictators have total control over the lives of their citizens and usually people are not allowed to voice their negative opinions or vote. Dictatorships can be defined as authoritarian regimes, or totalitarian government where leaders typically acquired control by force.

Monarchy is one of the oldest types of government. Common titles for monarchs include king, queen, emperor, empress, czar, kaiser, sultan, and shah. This person is often appointed (chosen) because of a family tradition and serves for life or until they abdicate (leave) the throne. Constitutional monarchies are limited by a constitution, limit the monarch's power. The monarch is usually only for ceremonial purposes, such as in the United Kingdom.
