

Alexander Hamilton was born either 1755 or 1757 (no one knows for sure) on the Caribbean island of Nevis. Hamilton's father left the family when he was young, and his mother passed away two years later. He lived with various relatives and got his first job as an accounting clerk in St. Croix around 11 years old.

With the help of locals, and his employer Nicolas Cruger, Hamilton was sent to America for an education in 1772, just as the colonies were preparing for war with Great Britain. He attended a private school when he was 15 and in 1773 he enrolled in King's College. However, before he finished school, the colonies began protesting against the actions of King George III and the British Parliament. As a result, Hamilton became interested in colonial politics.

In 1775, the Revolutionary War began. The colonies were fighting for their independence from Great Britain. The college was shut down due to battles and Hamilton went to fight with the patriots. In 1776, Hamilton rose through the ranks, established his reputation, and became a trusted advisor to general George Washington. When the war ended, Hamilton started a law practice in New York in 1783.

In 1787, Hamilton was invited to attend the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Hamilton was chosen as one of three delegates to represent New York. Here, delegates gathered to discuss changes to the Articles of the Confederation (America's current plan of government). Hamilton believed in a strong central government. He was frustrated with the lack of power given to the federal government under the Articles of Confederation. Believing strongly that the Articles were not working, he
