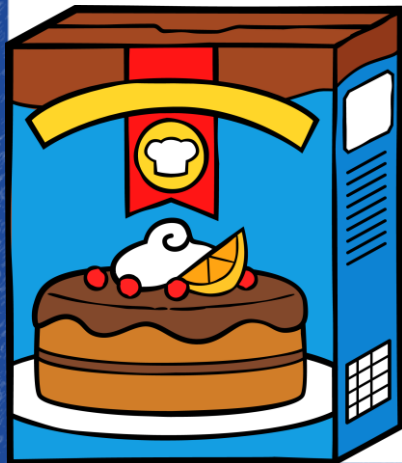


CAKE MIX

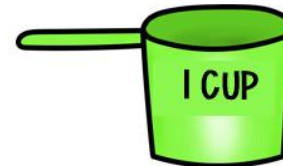
BAKING SODA

In 1584, Queen Elizabeth I granted the land of Virginia to Sir Walter Raleigh. England wanted to establish a colony on Roanoke Island as an attempt to expand the British Empire in the New World. This charter specifically stated that Raleigh must establish a North American colony, or he would lose his right to colonization. Sir Walter

Raleigh never actually visited North America, instead he sent expeditions led by other men.

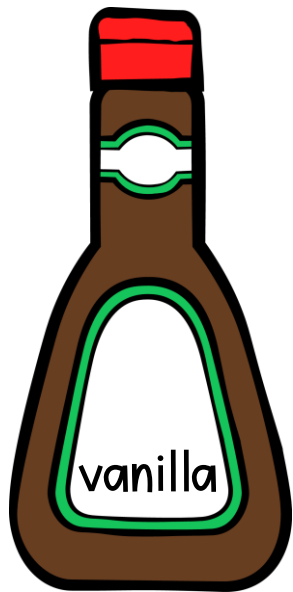

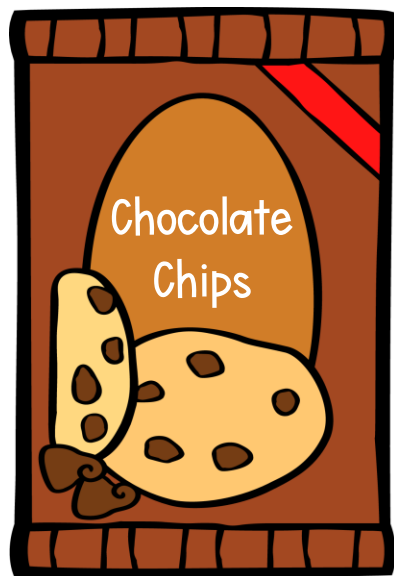

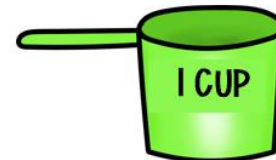
CHOCOLATE CHIPS
