

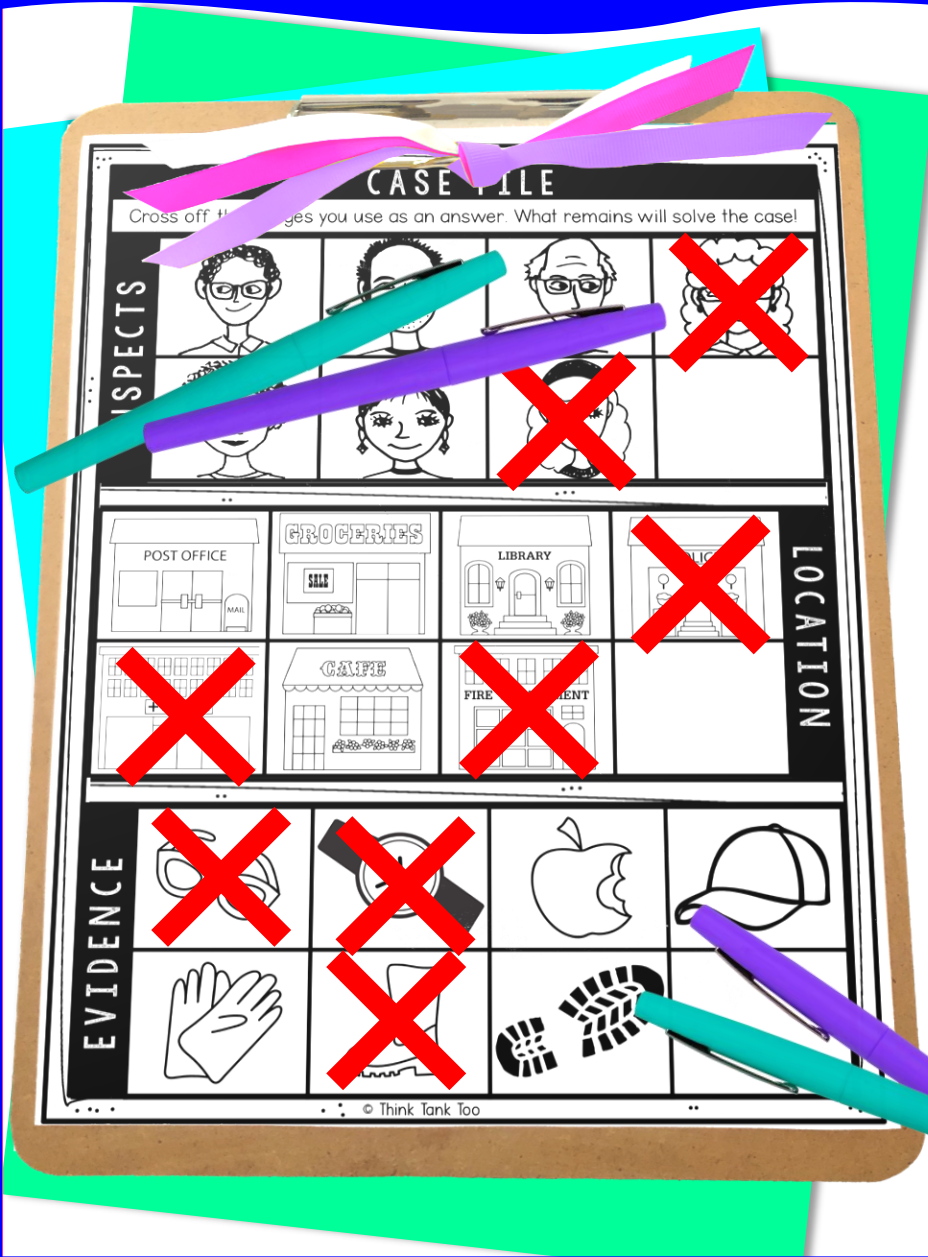

After answering each question, students will find evidence in the text to support their answer.

FEDERALISTS & ANTI-FEDERALISTS

George Washington became the first President of the United States after the Revolutionary War. He was elected President 1789 and remained in office until 1797. At that time, there was no political force in the United States. There were many different opinions about the United States and what the government should do. However, there were two political parties as we know them today.

During George Washington's presidency, though, some of the founders of the United States who were helping to shape the new government had very different views as to how to run the country. They called themselves the Democratic-Republicans. As would be expected, many of the men had different opinions in shaping the government. The Democratic-Republican party was founded by Thomas Jefferson and James Madison in 1792. There were factions (small organized groups) being formed within the Democratic-Republicans because of different priorities among the founders of the U.S. government. Washington disliked the factions that were forming in his government and took a stand against them, but that didn't stop them from getting bigger and gaining more followers.

Now, in addition to the Democratic-Republican political party, there was the Federalist party formed by Alexander Hamilton. The Federalists wanted a strong national government that took a firm lead over the power of the individual states. The country was in an economic depression with a lot of debt (money owed) and the Articles of Confederation were weak and the nation needed to be united. Federalists wanted to address these concerns.

Some of the most prominent (well-known) members of the Federalist party were John Adams, Alexander Hamilton, John Jay, and John Marshall. Adams became the 2nd president of the U.S. Hamilton was Washington's Secretary of the Treasury. Jay helped draft the Treaty of Paris with England. Marshall was one of the first judges of the Supreme Court.

During the 1790s, when the Federalists and Democratic-Republicans were
