



Full lesson plans with essential questions and activities that help students identify similes and metaphors in poetry. It also gives students practice writing their own poetry using similes and metaphors.






Collaborative or individual student practice identifying and applying sensory language to poetry. Students will understand the way descriptive language impacts the meaning of a poem.




Poetry Talk Sentence Stems gives students starter sentences to help them appropriately discuss any poem they read in class. This resource is editable.
