“Yes ma’am,” Jacob said as he walked slowly up the stairs.

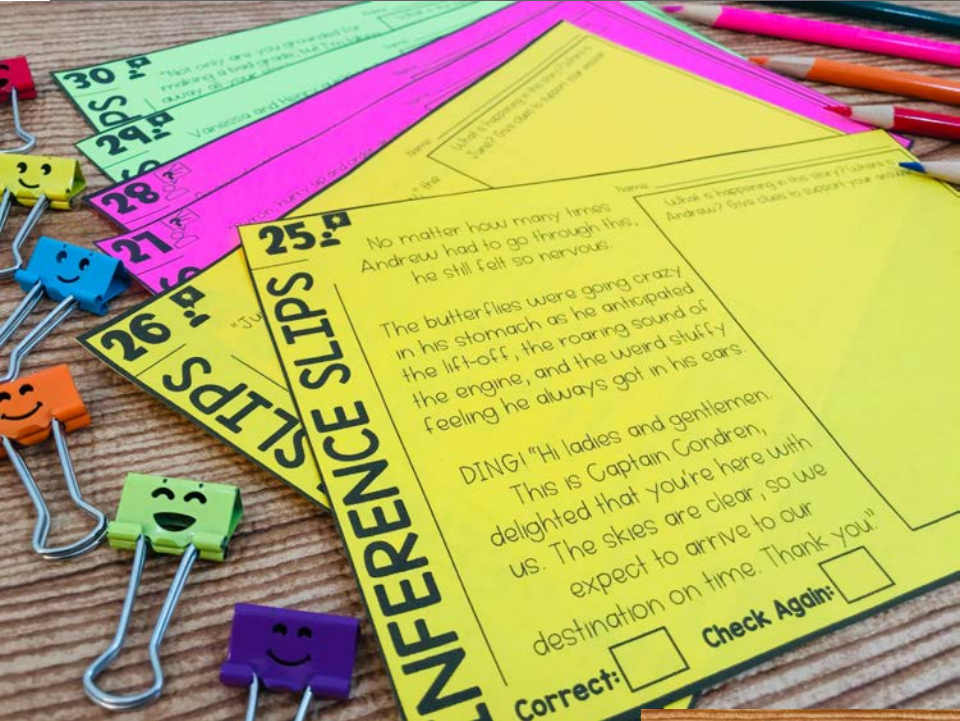
