



Butterfly WAYS TO USE THESE READING CHALLENGES

SUGGESTED IDEA #1: This resource has one set of bookmarks that are not numbered. I print several of these out, but I don't cut them apart. I leave them in a basket that is easily accessible to students. The basket is labeled, "Are You Up For A Spring Reading Challenge?" Students complete the bookmarks at their own pace. For each bookmark that students complete and cut out, they drop it in a small box that I also have in the classroom. At the end of every month, I pull out the completed bookmarks and give out prizes to students who completed the challenges.



SUGGESTED IDEA #2: You can also use this resource for Spring holiday breaks outside of school. I am always looking for ways to encourage my students to read while at home. Having fun challenges prevents them from saying, "I don't know what to read!" or "Reading is boring!" Each challenge gives them interesting reading ideas with a variety of ways to fulfill them. Students who come back from Spring break with completed bookmarks also earn the certificate and a fun extra prize to go with it.
