

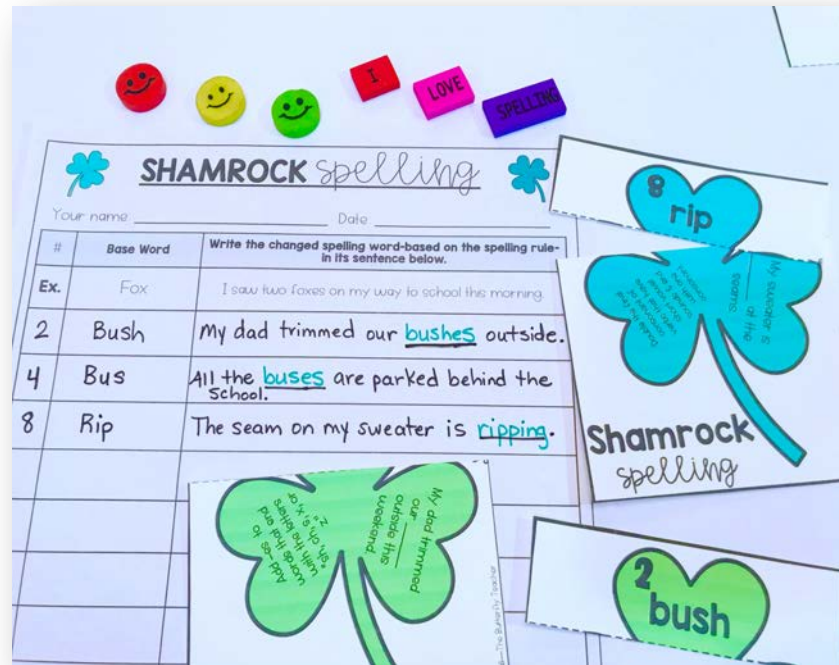
SHAMROCK SPELLING PREVIEW

This resource has **40 Shamrock Spelling Cards** that can be used in three different ways:

OPTION 1:

Cut the shamrocks apart and have your students match each spelling rule with its sentence to the correct base word.

They can extend their work with the response sheet, where they will write the base word with the spelling rule applied.



OPTION 2:

Leave each shamrock in one whole piece so that students see the base word, spelling rule, and example sentence together.

Then play a SCOOT game where students can write the changed spelling word based on its spelling rule.

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SPELLING RULES COVERED

Here are the spelling rules included in this resource:

- Adding “es” to words that end with -ch, -sh, -s, -x, or -z (ex. buses)
- Dropping the “y” and adding an “i,” then “es” to words that have a consonant before the y. (ex. babies)
- Keeping the “y” and adding “s” to words that have a vowel before the y. (ex. monkeys)
- Dropping the “f” at the end of words to add “ves” (ex. elves)

More Helpful Things to Know:

- Verbs and nouns are included
- Extra blank shamrocks are included for students to write their own spelling words on them for extended practice.
- An Editable Template is included for you to type spelling words for your students for additional practice.
