Graphic notation is used to show short and long sounds and silence.



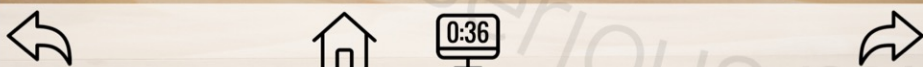
HALF NOTES LOOK LIKE

A sound that lasts two beats.



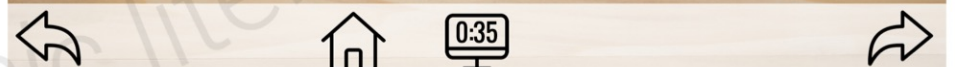

BEETHOVEN'S SYMPHONIES

Beethoven's 7th Symphony had four movements. It premiered in Vienna at a charity concert for wounded soldiers from the Battle of Hanau. After hearing it for the first time, the audience demanded an encore (a repeat performance) of the second movement, *Allegretto*. Beethoven had already discovered he was going deaf when he composed his 7th Symphony. By the time he wrote his ninth and final symphony, he was completely deaf.
