WILLIAM GRANT STILL
1895-1978

- His family was musical. His father was a local bandleader, and his grandmother often sang African-American spirituals to him
- He wrote operas, orchestral works, chamber music, choral music, and more
- He was the first African-American to conduct a leading American orchestra
- He was the first African-American to have a major orchestra play one of his symphonies
- He was the first African-American to have jazz into his music, which you can hear in his 1st symphony
- He was the first African-American to have an opera produced by a major opera company, the New York City Opera

- She composed operas, concertos, and chamber music
- She was part of the women's suffrage movement and fought for the right to vote

JOHN WILLIAMS
Born in 1932

- He is a composer, pianist, and conductor
- He is best known for his film scores, including *Star Wars*, *Jaws*, *Jurassic Park*, and *Indiana Jones*
- He was conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra
- In addition to film music, he has composed concertos, and chamber works

JENNIFER HIGDON
Born in 1962

- She is a flutist, teacher, and composer
- As a child, she listened to rock and folk music from the 60's
- She's composed chamber music, vocal and choral works, orchestral works, wind ensemble and band music, and an opera
- She won the Pulitzer Prize for Music in 2009 and won two Grammy Awards for Best Contemporary Classical Composition

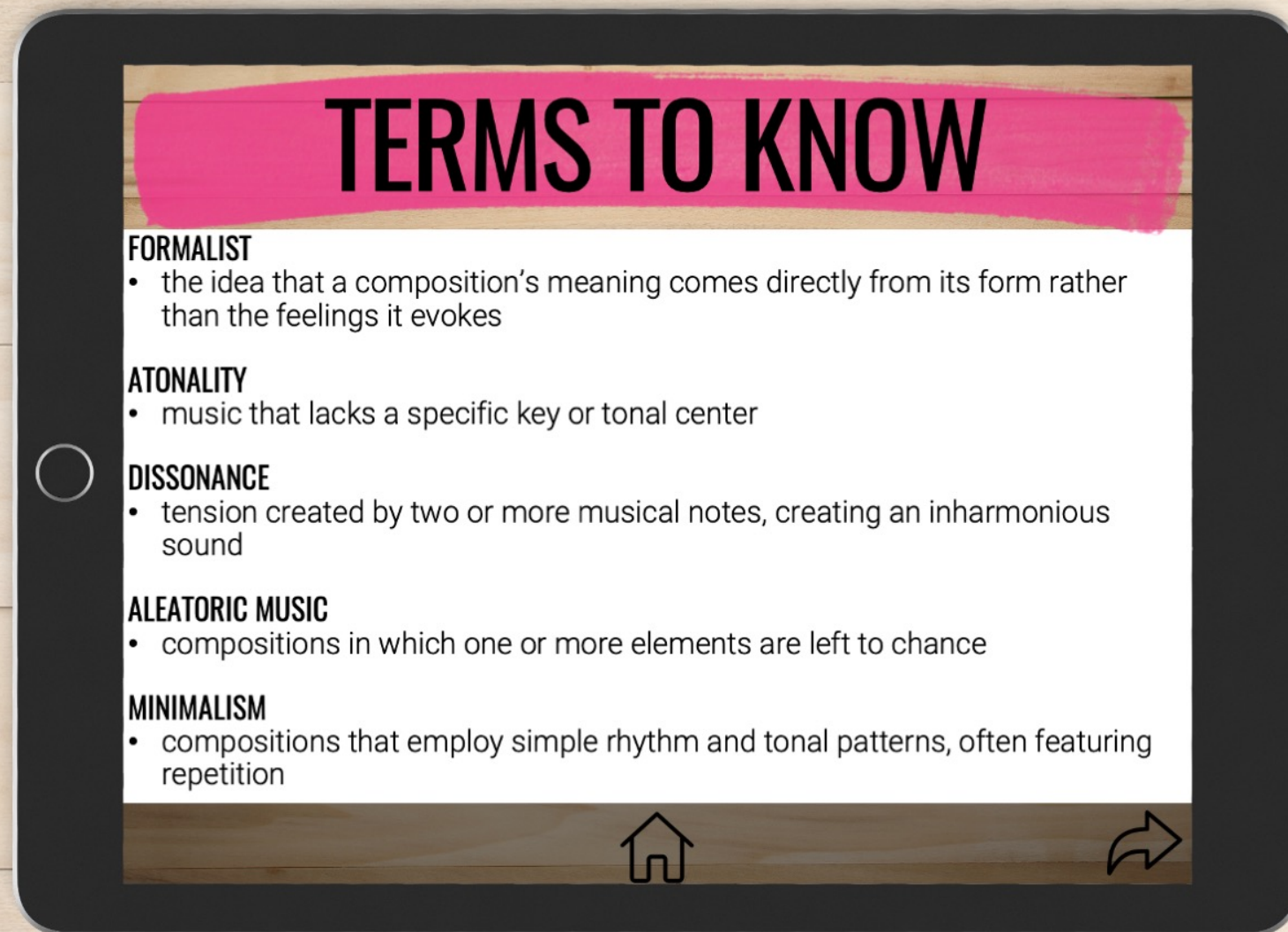

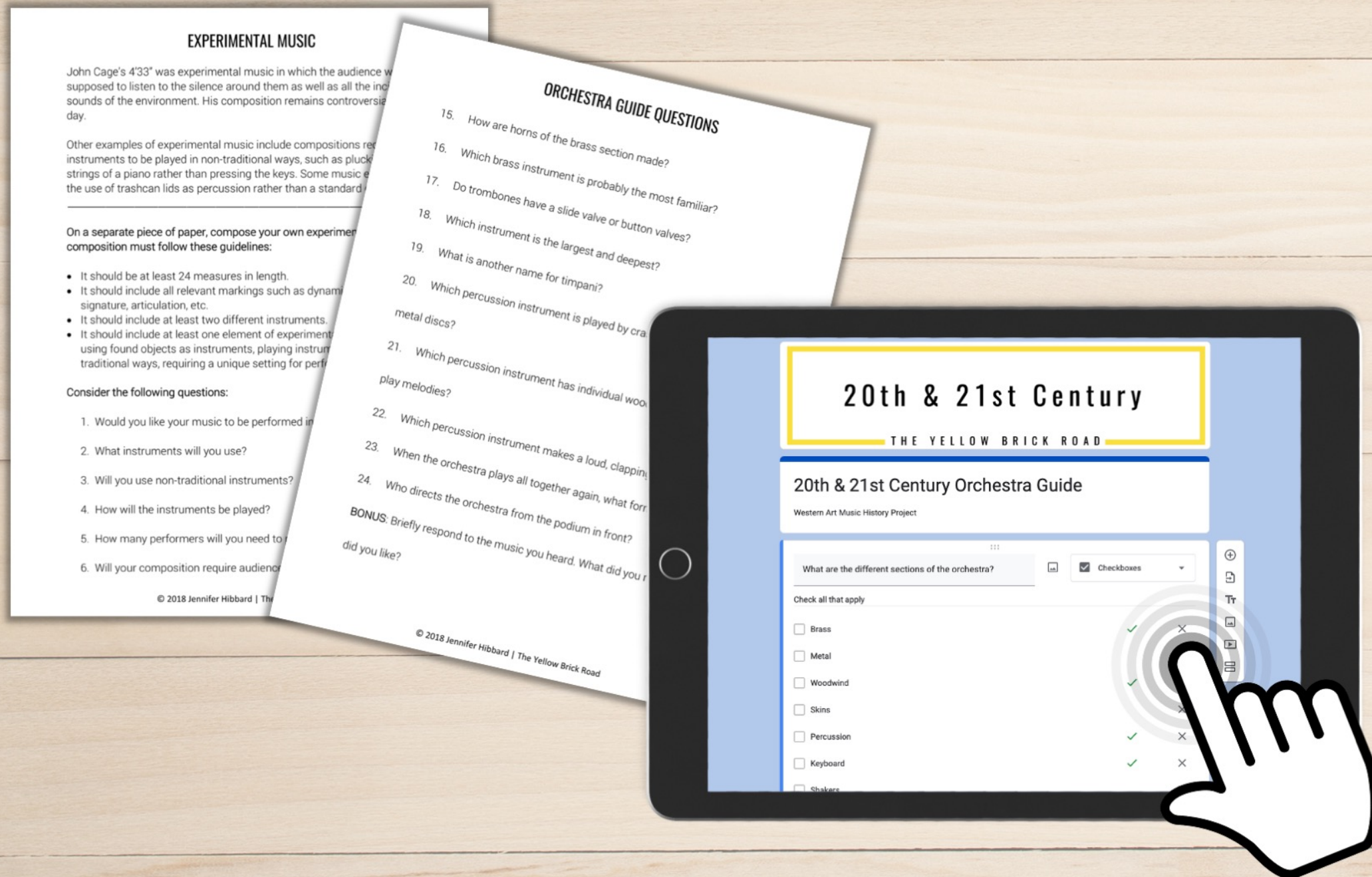

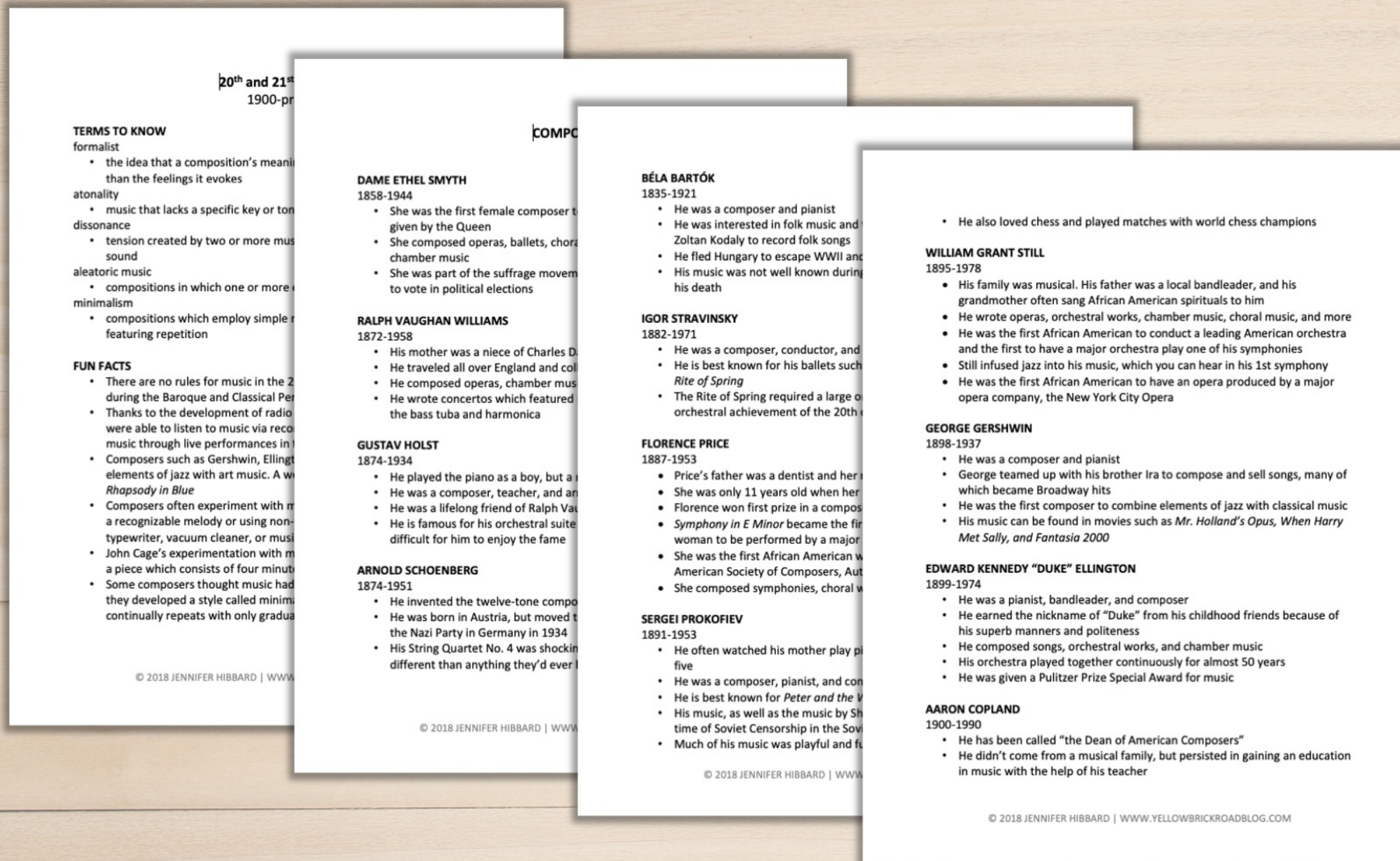
